### Opening Sentence

*Officiant says one of the following verses of Holy Scripture.*

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us;  
but if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just,  
will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. - I John 1:8, 9

Rend your hearts and not your garments. Return to the Lord  
your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and  
abounding in steadfast love, and repents of evil. - Joel 2:13

### Confession of Sin

*The Officiant says to the people*

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

*A few moments of silence are observed to prepare our hearts for confession.*

*Officiant and People*

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

*Officiant*

Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. **Amen.**

## The Invitatory and Psalter

*Officiant* Lord, open our lips.  
*People* **And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.**

*Officiant and People*

**Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit:  
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.**

*Officiant* The Lord is full of compassion and mercy:  
*People* **Come let us adore him.**

**Venite** *Said in unison*

Come, let us sing to the Lord; \*  
let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation.  
Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving \*  
and raise a loud shout to him with psalms.

and a great King above all gods.  
In his hand are the caverns of the earth, \*

**Psalms 41 and 52** *Said in unison*

**41** *Beatus qui intelligit*

- 1 Happy are they who consider the poor and needy! \*  
the LORD will deliver them in the time of trouble.
- 2 The LORD preserves them and keeps them alive,  
so that they may be happy in the land; \*  
he does not hand them over to the will of their enemies.
- 3 The LORD sustains them on their sickbed \*  
and ministers to them in their illness.
- 4 I said, "LORD, be merciful to me; \*  
heal me, for I have sinned against you."

- 5 My enemies are saying wicked things about me: \*  
When will he die, and his name perish?"
- 6 Even if they come to see me, they speak empty words; \*  
their heart collects false rumors;  
they go outside and spread them.
- 7 All my enemies whisper together about me \*  
and devise evil against me.
- 8 "A deadly thing," they say, "has fastened on him; \*  
he has taken to his bed and will never get up again."
- 9 Even my best friend, whom I trusted,  
who broke bread with me, \*  
has lifted up his heel and turned against me.
- 10 But you, O LORD, be merciful to me and raise me up, \*  
and I shall repay them.
- 11 By this I know you are pleased with me, \*  
that my enemy does not triumph over me.
- 12 In my integrity you hold me fast, \*  
and shall set me before your face for ever.
- 13 Blessed be the LORD God of Israel, \*  
from age to age. Amen. Amen.

**52** *Quid gloriaris?*

- 1 You tyrant, why do you boast of wickedness \*  
against the godly all day long?
- 2 You plot ruin;  
your tongue is like a sharpened razor, \*  
O worker of deception.
- 3 You love evil more than good \*  
and lying more than speaking the truth.
- 4 You love all words that hurt, \*  
O you deceitful tongue.
- 5 Oh, that God would demolish you utterly, \*  
topple you, and snatch you from your dwelling,  
and root you out of the land of the living!
- 6 The righteous shall see and tremble, \*  
and they shall laugh at him, saying,
- 7 "This is the one who did not take God for a refuge, \*  
but trusted in great wealth  
and relied upon wickedness."

- 8 But I am like a green olive tree in the house of God; \*  
I trust in the mercy of God for ever and ever.
- 9 I will give you thanks for what you have done \*  
and declare the goodness of your Name in the presence of the godly.

## First Lesson

### Deuteronomy 8:11-20

Take care that you do not forget the Lord your God, by failing to keep his commandments, his ordinances, and his statutes, which I am commanding you today. When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them, and when your herds and flocks have multiplied, and your silver and gold is multiplied, and all that you have is multiplied, then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid waste-land with poisonous snakes and scorpions. He made water flow for you from flint rock, and fed you in the wilderness with

manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good. Do not say to yourself, 'My power and the might of my own hand have gained me this wealth.' But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today. If you do forget the Lord your God and follow other gods to serve and worship them, I solemnly warn you today that you shall surely perish. Like the nations that the Lord is destroying before you, so shall you perish, because you would not obey the voice of the Lord your God.

*People*            **Thanks be to God.**

### **The First Song of Isaiah** *Said in unison*

Surely, it is God who saves me; \*  
I will trust in him and not be afraid.  
For the Lord is my stronghold and my sure defense, \*  
and he will be my Savior.  
Therefore you shall draw water with rejoicing \*  
from the springs of salvation.  
And on that day you shall say, \*  
Give thanks to the Lord and call upon his Name;  
  
Make his deeds known among the peoples; \*  
see that they remember that his Name is exalted.  
Sing the praises of the Lord, for he has done great things, \*  
and this is known in all the world.  
Cry aloud, inhabitants of Zion, ring out your joy, \*  
for the great one in the midst of you is the Holy One of Israel.  
Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: \*  
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

## Second Lesson

### Hebrews 2:11-18

For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, saying,

'I will proclaim your name  
to my brothers and sisters,  
in the midst of the congregation  
I will praise you.'

And again,

'I will put my trust in him.'

And again,

'Here am I and the children  
whom God has given me.'

Since, therefore, the children share flesh and blood, he himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

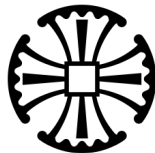

We pray also today for our Worship ministries, especially:

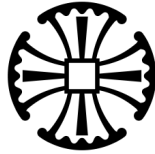
Music ministries, that the words and harmonies sung in corporate worship may bring those who attend closer to the Word of God; and
