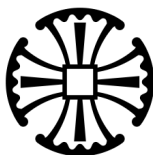

because you, O LORD, have helped me and comforted me.

We pray for our own parish family, and those dear to them, remembering today especially:

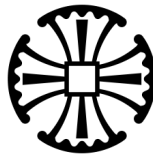
