Opening Sentence

Officiant says one of the following verses of Holy Scripture.

Watch, for you know not when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning; lest he come suddenly and find you asleep. - *Mark 13:35, 36*

Confession of Sin

The Officiant says to the people

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Officiant and People

First Lesson

Isaiah 2:1-11

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw
 concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

In days to come

 Many peoples shall come and say,
 'Come, let us go up

 and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem.
 He shall judge between the nations,

 nation shall not lift up sword against nation,
 neither shall they learn war any more.

O house of Jacob,
 come, let us walk

Luke 20:19-26


When the scribes and chief priests realized that Jesus had told this parable against them, they wanted to lay hands on him at that very hour, but they feared the people.

So they watched him and sent spies who pretended to be honest, in order to trap him by what he said, so as to hand him over to the jurisdiction and authority of the governor. So they asked him, 'Teacher, we know that you are right in what you say and teach, and you show deference to no one, but teach the way of

God in accordance with truth. Is it lawful for us to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?' But he perceived their craftiness and said to them, 'Show me a denarius. Whose head and whose title does it bear?' They said, 'The emperor's.' He said to them, 'Then give to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's.' And they were not able in the presence of the people to trap him by what he said; and being amazed by his answer, they became silent.


The Song of Zechariah *Said in unison*
