

WELCOME! Visit our welcome desk in the Narthex any Sunday for ministry information or to simply connect with us! New? Pick up an olivewood cross, our gift to you.

BAPTISMS are generally administered on Easter Eve, Pentecost, All Saints' Sunday and the first Sunday after Epiphany. Pre-baptism classes are scheduled and held seasonally. A person of any age may receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism. The application form for baptismal candidates is available online under the WORSHIP tab. **Next Baptism Date: Sunday, November 3, All Saints' Sunday**

THE SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE requires a minimum of 90 days notice to our office and requires premarital counseling. An initial conference with the clergy should be scheduled by the couple to review the process and any special circumstances before commitments may be made. Please contact Jo Wood to schedule.

FUNERAL OR MEMORIAL SERVICES for communicants of the parish are customarily held in the church and may include the celebration of the Holy Eucharist.



Jeremiah is often referred to as "the weeping prophet" because of his great personal sacrifice and the profound grief he experienced as God's chosen people abandoned their covenantal identity and calling. This ten-week study will provide a comprehensive overview of the Book of Jeremiah, its history and importance for the Church today.

Money Matters

A Personal Journey of Giving

I was fortunate to grow up in a comfortable home where all my basic needs were met as well as the occasional luxury. Of course, there were times when we just couldn't afford some of the things my friends were enjoying, whether it was a pair of designer sneakers or the latest technology. Nevertheless, life was good. I didn't have to think very much about money. Yet as I grew older, and decided that I wanted to drive my own car and buy the latest stereo equipment, money became more important. I still remember my dad co-signing my first credit application, so I could qualify for a credit card and expand my financial horizons. I remember my first job, my first paycheck, and the first deposit into my savings account. Eventually I arrived at the realization that when it comes to almost everything involved in daily living – *money matters*.

However, throughout this process of financial maturation, I had a harder time making the connection between money and spirituality. Of course, growing up in the church I heard the occasional stewardship sermon. I would watch as parishioners threw a few crumbled dollar bills in the offering plate as it was passed down the pew. During the Lenten

season, I would diligently fill up my “mite box” to be placed on the altar on Easter Sunday. But as I approached adulthood, these practices seemed trite and disconnected from the *real world* of making money, paying bills, making investments, and building a future.

All of that changed when, as a college student, I attended a conference at another church. The speaker shared her testimony of coming to faith in Christ and how that experience changed her entire outlook on life, including how she spent her money. She reflected on the spiritual discipline of tithing, the giving of the ten percent back to God as an act of worship and gratitude. She shared about the freedom and joy she experienced as a result of making *generosity* a priority in her spiritual life. As I listened to her testimony, I can only describe what I experienced as a moment of conversion, a moment when I felt compelled to make the discipline of tithing an integral part of my life as a follower of Jesus. It was in that moment of conversion that I arrived at the realization that when it comes to living a life of faithfulness to God's call – *money matters*.

As a college student engaged to be married, I wasn't making

a lot of money. Nevertheless, I made the commitment to tithe to my local congregation. For over twenty years, this spiritual discipline has been a transformative part of my spiritual journey. It has been transformative because *it is not always easy!* There have been times when I have fretted over bills that needed to be paid, savings goals that needed to be met, college expenses that needed to be planned for.

Yet through all of these financial ups and downs, my wife and I have remained steadfast in our commitment to *generosity*. Our monthly tithe is not simply another bill to be paid. It is a spiritual discipline, an act of worship, an expression of gratitude and joy in response to God’s unconditional love and extravagant grace.

And so, this fall, as we reflect together on the theme of *generosity*, how is God challenging you to make *giving* a priority in your spiritual life? How is God calling you to grow in *generosity*? What next step can you take to increase your commitment to use your resources to further God’s mission in the world? When it comes to the sustainability of the mission and ministry to which we have been called, there is one thing we can be sure of – *money matters*.

The Church’s Response to Human Trafficking





TODAY


The ministry of the church doesn't stop. Every day we are engaged in some form of ministry that requires support and financial resources. The *operating budget* of the church covers all the daily expenses, including staff, administration, utilities, building maintenance, and program expenses. The *financial pledges* and weekly *offerings* provide the income that funds these ongoing expenses.

TOMORROW

In addition to the daily operations of the church, we frequently raise funds for both short-term and long-term *projects*. These may include outreach initiatives, Building improvements, capital campaigns, or anything other project that falls outside the normal operations of the parish. These projects are funded primarily through *restricted gifts* and *designated offerings*.

FOREVER

Finally, it is our responsibility to ensure the future financial sustainability of our congregation and to provide the resources necessary for the next generation to continue to serve our community. Our *endowment* and other *investment funds* have been created to provide this long-range sustainability. Through *memorial offerings* and *bequests*, we can develop our investments funds in order to ensure a bright future for our congregation. It is important that all of us make provision for the church in our *wills* and *estate planning*.

Currently, seven percent of Good Shepherd's operating budget comes from sales at our thrift shop, Pennies for Heaven. That's a budgeted amount of \$55,000! Special sales held throughout the year generally contribute an additional \$5,000-\$7,000. When you shop at Pennies, you are truly supporting Good Shepherd mission and ministry.

Throughout the year, the Outreach & Mission Committee offers a variety of opportunities for the members of Good Shepherd – of every age and ability – to offer their gifts in the service of others.

Our programs operate on two levels: the BIG projects that involve the whole congregation, and the ongoing programs that require a regular commitment of time or effort. We have already conducted several BIG projects this year:

our Food Packing for Haiti, the hygiene kit collection for the **Warfield School**, and our Lenten Collection in support of **CROS Ministries' Summer Camps**. Then, beginning in mid-July, we launched our annual Back to School collection which, as usual, was a resounding success. On August 5 we delivered a truckload of school supplies which included nearly 100 backpacks, over 200 boxes of crayons, 250 notebooks, almost 300 packages of pencils, as well as erasers, glue sticks, highlighters, scissors, and boxes of Kleenex! We also offer a special 'shout out' to David Loetell, who contributed 800 toothbrushes and 500 tubes of toothpaste!

Our next BIG parish-wide effort will be the annual **Thanksgiving Run 4 the Pies**, in which we collect thousands of pounds of canned goods and non-perishable food items, to stock our own **Food Pantry** shelves and to supply needed items to CROS Ministries' Food Pantries in Palm Beach and Martin Counties. That will be followed by an Advent collection, most likely of clothing or other items needed by the children of the Warfield School in Indiantown.

St. George's Mission in Riviera Beach is an area where we are EXPANDING our efforts. For several years, volunteers from Good Shepherd have prepared one evening meal per month for the approximately 200 homeless men, women and children who depend on the mission for sustenance. St. George's has recently added access to a mobile shower unit, and volunteers are needed during the day to help with handing out soaps and towels and clean clothes. For those who can't make a commitment of time, but would like to help, please consider donating travel-sized toiletries, or new or gently-used towels. We will also be doing occasional **"Done in a Day" projects** at St. George's, such as painting rooms or cleaning dining hall furniture; contact Denise Preston (denisepreston@mac.com), or look for announcements of upcoming events in the Sunday bulletin.

In order to be a "Beacon of Light" to the community, we have to be INVOLVED in the community! In the months ahead, we will be offering many additional opportunities to serve. Look for announcements in the bulletin about gleanings with CROS ministries, special projects working with the homeless, even a future mission trip. Outreach has a place for everyone!!!!

Good Shepherd partners with Palm Beach Roadrunners to provide logistics support and receives thousands of pounds of non-perishable food items for area food pantries, including our own.



GIVING F.A.Q.

WHAT ARE SOME WAYS I CAN LIVE INTO THE SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINE OF GENEROSITY?

Generosity is highly personal because it's dependent on your gratitude, your experience, your motivation to serve, and where you are in your own faith journey. Good Shepherd is developing a variety of meaningful giving options to enable us to live into our lives of faith as disciples of Christ.

WHAT IS STEWARDSHIP?

In its most basic sense, Stewardship is the activity or job of protecting and being responsible for something entrusted to one's care. At Good Shepherd, we believe that stewardship is a part of our spiritual journey and our relationship with God.

WHAT IS A PLEDGE?

It is a commitment that allows church leadership to determine a budget for the coming year. Pledging is also a response to God's call and abundance in our own lives: it is a statement of thanksgiving.

WHY DO WE ASK FOR ANNUAL PLEDGES?

We are all stakeholders in the success of our church. Annual pledges support everything we do at Good Shepherd — from paying clergy to supporting our outreach ministries, to making possible our liturgical, education and music offerings. In order to know what we can do each year, we receive pledge commitments so that we may budget accordingly.

DON'T WEEKLY CONTRIBUTIONS COVER OUR EXPENSES?

Weekly non-pledge offerings amount to approximately 8% of our annual budgeted revenue. The single most important source of funding for our ministries comes from the payment of pledges that were made during our stewardship campaign. These gifts provide 68% of the church's income. Pennies For Heaven Thrift Shop and Artie's Party provide an additional 13% of budgeted income, and the remaining 11% comes from other sources including our endowment income and facility usage fees. That's the math. Your personal reflection on God's blessings and response of generosity are what truly cover our expenses and fund mission.

HOW MUCH SHOULD I GIVE?

That's up to you. We don't want you to live into a budget. We want you to live into the Bible. Do you think about gratitude? Do feel that God's gifts are abundant? Pray on it. Generosity is not one-size-fits-all. There are many opportunities to give that you may not even have considered. In the coming months you will hear from our Giving Team about some new options.
