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# WHAT BOYFRIEND PRIVILEGES REALLY ARE

*The benefits of access without accountability.*

Boyfriend privileges are the unearned access many men receive in relationships before they have proven themselves worthy of husband responsibilities. They enjoy the benefits of a girlfriend's love, time, attention, intimacy, and support—without the weight of commitment, leadership, or sacrifice.



## THE PURPOSE OF DATING

Dating is not a reward for showing interest. It is a process of discovery with a purpose. The goal is not to see how much you can get, but to find out if the person is who God says he is for you.

Purposeful dating protects your heart, your body, and your future. It helps you discern character, values, and calling—long before you combine your life with another.

*Dating without direction is how you end up in a relationship that looks good on the outside but feels heavy on the inside.*

## WHY PRIVILEGES WITHOUT COMMITMENT CREATE CONFUSION

When a man receives the benefits of a relationship without the responsibility of leading one, it creates confusion for both of you.

**It confuses your heart.** You start to believe he values you more than he actually does.

**It delays your purpose.** You settle for potential instead of waiting for provision.

**It weakens your boundaries.** You tolerate behavior you would never accept from a husband.

**It sets the wrong precedent.** You teach him how to treat you by what you allow.

“Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?”

## THE BENEFITS HE GETS

Boyfriend privileges often sound harmless on the surface. After all, what's wrong with a man enjoying your company, your affection, or even your support?

The problem isn't the benefit itself—it's the lack of responsibility that comes with it.

Some of the most common privileges include:

- **Access to your time** — He has you when it's convenient for him, not because he is committed to you as a priority.
- **Emotional support** — You become his therapist, cheerleader, and peace without the protection of a promise.
- **Physical intimacy** — He receives what God designed for covenant without the accountability of covenant.
- **Public benefits, private status** — You show up for him in public, but he won't claim you in private.
- **Future language, no future plan** — He talks about “one day” but avoids the actions that build toward it.

## GOD'S DESIGN IS DIFFERENT

God's design for relationships is intentional. He created a pattern for protection and peace. Notice the order:

DISCERNMENT → COMMITMENT → COVENANT → ACCESS

When we flip the order, pain follows. But when we honor the order, blessing flows.

Wisdom is knowing the difference between a man who wants something from you and a man who wants something *with* you.

*You don't need a man who wants the benefits. You need a man who is ready for the responsibility.*

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# HUSBAND RESPONSIBILITIES: THE STANDARD, NOT THE EXCEPTION

*A real man does not ask what he can get.  
He decides what he is willing to give.*

**W**hen a man chooses to become a husband, everything changes. The focus shifts from me to we. From what I want to what I will sacrifice for. Biblical marriage was never designed to be convenient—it was designed to be covenantal.



**A husband is called to lead, love, and lay down his life—daily. These are not optional. They are the evidence of his commitment.**

## 1. LEADERSHIP: HE LEADS WITH WISDOM

A husband is the spiritual leader of his home. He does not dominate—he discerns, decides, and directs with God’s wisdom.

*“For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church.”*

EPHESIANS 5:23

## 2. PROTECTION: HE CREATES A PLACE OF SAFETY

A husband protects his wife, his children, his home, and the vision God has given him. Protection is not just physical—it’s emotional, spiritual, and relational.

*“He who finds a wife finds a good thing and obtains favor from the Lord.”*

PROVERBS 18:22

## 3. PROVISION: HE PROVIDES WITHOUT EXCUSE

A husband works, plans, and provides. He is a provider by design, not by mood. He makes sure his family lacks nothing necessary for godly living.

*“But if anyone does not provide for his own, and especially for those of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.”*

1 TIMOTHY 5:8

## 4. SACRIFICE: HE PUTS HER BEFORE HIMSELF

A husband loves like Christ—selflessly. He chooses her well-being over his comfort. He serves, not to be seen, but because love requires sacrifice.

*“Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.”*

JOHN 15:13

## 5. FAITHFULNESS: HE IS COMMITTED

A husband is faithful in word, in thought, and in action. He guards his heart and honors his covenant.

*“A man of faithfulness will abound with blessings.”*

PROVERBS 28:20

## 6. ACCOUNTABILITY: HE ANSWERS TO GOD

A husband knows he will give an account for how he loved, led, and provided. He doesn’t operate without responsibility.

*“Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong.”*

1 CORINTHIANS 16:13

## RESPONSIBILITY ALWAYS PRECEDES ACCESS.

Before a man receives the benefits of a wife, he must prove he is ready to carry the weight of a husband. Access without accountability is a recipe for pain. Commitment before intimacy protects hearts and preserves purpose.

- Avoid hard conversations
- Expect submission without setting the standard
- Use love as a tool for control
- Lead when it’s easy but disappear when it’s hard

### FOR MEN

- Am I requesting access without accepting the responsibility?
- Have I been avoiding hard conversations about commitment and purpose?
- Am I leading, providing, and protecting in the areas God has called me to?
- Am I truly ready for the weight of a husband's commitment?

### A PRAYER

Father, thank You for showing me the difference between temporary access and eternal assignment. Help me to wait on the right person, not just the right time. Protect my heart from settling, and prepare me for the covenant You have designed for me. In Jesus' name, Amen.

### A DECLARATION
