## How to Use This Guide

Each week includes five short readings, one for each weekday, Monday through Friday, built around a key passage and truth from Scripture.

- **MONDAY–FRIDAY:** Read one passage a day.

- **WEEKEND:** Review the week's theme. Ask God how He's shaping your heart through His Word. These moments aren't about checking a box, they're about slowing down, listening, and letting God's Word renew your mind. Whether you read it with your family, or alone in a quiet moment, this guide will help you take one step closer to Jesus each day.

### **PROVERBS DEVOTIONAL GUIDE INTRODUCTION SUMMARY:**

Wisdom in Proverbs = God-centered skill for living well in every area of life.

Foundational assumptions that are woven into Proverbs:

1. We must make choices in life

2. The choices we make have significant consequences
  1. Consequence #1 – Choices take us places
  2. Consequence #2 – Choices affect our hearts ***“Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life” Proverbs 4:23 (ESV)***
  3. Consequence #3 – Choices affect future choices
  4. Consequence #4 – Choices made in this life are sealed into eternity after death.
3. Every human makes bad choices with negative consequences. Who can say ***“I have made my heart pure; I am clean from my sin” Proverbs 20:9 (ESV)***
4. Wisdom is God’s goal for us
5. Wisdom begins with the fear of the Lord ***“Do you see a man who is wise in his own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him” Proverbs 26:12 (ESV)***
6. Wisdom is a pathway, not a doorway
