By fostering a visible, credible, and consistent presence, PEACE PATROL OFFICERS (PPOs) act as advocates for safety and serve as trusted community resources.

Equip disenfranchised men with skills, training, and opportunities for sustainable employment.

Our first paid PEACE PATROL cohort paid \$16/hr for a 30 day cohort that included 12 work days with pre and post-employment case managment

10 PEACE PATROL participants completed their cohort

- 5 (50%) of participants were age 45 or older
- Primary goals included: Employment, Housing, and Workforce Development
- 6 (60%) had achieved at least one of their goals during participation in the program.
- 6 (60%) had experienced incarceration personally
