

Description: After accidentally not telling his father he had returned to the city from a doctor's appointment in Maryland, Homer faced a dilemma like no other in his lifetime. Thus Homer experienced a culture shock of living in someone else's home for the first time while also adjusting to new employment. Homer's typical shifts were 3pm to 11pm and he had to get up at 6:30am the next morning to get to his 8am class on time.



Synopsis: Returning from Maryland, Homer goes to hang out with his friends. His dad calls and yells at him for not telling him he made it back from Maryland and demands he come home NOW. Homer disobeys and is given an ultimatum to either come home now or not at all. Homer says he'll come home later and gets hung up on. He tries calling him back and gets no answer. Homer stays overnight at his friend Mystic's house and gets a job at Wawa the next day. His father calls him back and demands he come home and Homer says no with his mind already made up. Given everything he had to process, Homer did not want to return to the childish feeling of being told what to do and when. A few days later he has his first shift at Wawa. 3pm to 11pm he works the register and has to deal with strange customers during certain purchase transactions. It is 11pm and Homer must wake up at 6:30am the next morning to get to his 8am class. He walks to college from Wiz's apartment, avoiding public transportation to save money. During his walks in the mornings before class Homer puts on his headphones and clears his mind.

Director's Statement:



Path Home is a film of self-discovery with eccentric relatable humor sprinkled throughout. This story is a telling of Homer's desire for independence as he faces the culture shock of a new residence and job simultaneously. He seeks refugee from the totalitarian ways of his father but then faces that of the real world.

Four years ago I didn't have a clear direction of where I wanted to end up in life. Looking back on and even during my experiences I was grateful it'd be a story to tell regardless of method. The events in this film are based on a true story.
