DATE: August 1, 2023

- RE: Stryker Lifepak 15 In-service Training
- DISTRIBUTION/TRAINING PERIOD: August 1, 2023 September 30, 2023

#### EFFECTIVE DATE: August 1, 2023

- An "In-service Training" module separate from regularly scheduled CME has been developed and is assigned to all system clinicians through Vector Solutions.
- The in-service includes:
  - New Stryker Lifepak 15 Inservice Training
  - Protocols impacted by implementation of the Stryker Lifepak 15
- The inservice training plan consists of two components:
  - A Vector Solutions assignment consisting of fourteen (14) short videos
    - The assignment will be posted on August 1, 2023
    - Every clinician will receive the assignment regardless of the delivery option
  - A hands-on classroom component with a "ticket-to-play" to complete for each student

- · The inservice training has two delivery options:
  - Option #1 Hybrid: The video assignment is completed prior to attending the classroom component
    - A certificate of completion for the video assignment must be printed and brought to the classroom component
    - The classroom component will have at least one CME instructor who will sign the ticket-to-play
  - Option #2 Mixed: The video assignment is completed as a part of the classroom portion of the training
    - · Each video is played during the hands-on portion of the classroom component
    - · No certificate of completion is required for the video assignment
    - The video assignment will be recorded as completed by the instructor of the classroom component
- The type of delivery will be determined by each Agency EMS Coordinator
- All system clinicians are required to complete both training portions no later than September 30, 2023
- Failure to complete this in-service by September 30, 2023, may result in clinical restriction or suspension.
- The protocols included with this Medical Control Directive are for TRAINING USE ONLY and NOT AUTHORIZED FOR USE at this time.


