
MD-5 EMS Fellow- Ken Dumas, MD

New Equipment!



The new Gas Clip CO monitor will begin Auto-Shipping to your departments starting the 2nd week of July.

Each department will receive a separate email showing your assets and the quantity you will be receiving.

You may start deploying these upon arrival. Please return the old CO protégé to Derek Schauer when convenient.

Every CO Monitor will come in a mesh bag with a keychain. Attached to the keychain will be a tag that will display the CO Monitor's serial number.

- Red Serial tag is FD only
- Blue serial tag is Ambulance only



On the MRX, the monitor will clip right on the metal loop of the <u>bag</u>.

On the LP15, the monitor will clip right into the metal ring of the LP15 monitor.







Beginning June 26, 2023, the EMS Ramp Construction project will begin. This project will ultimately widen the EMS ramp to accommodate our EMS volumes and make it safer for patient unloading.

This will impact traffic patterns, including the Eastbound lane on 6th Avenue which will be closed for several months at the EMS Ramp exit. We will maintain the site line for EMS crews upon exiting the EMS ramp. The actual ramp will not be affected during this first phase of construction. Thank you again for your partnership as we work to improve our EMS ramp and please feel free to reach out for any questions.

Tactical Paramedic Training 2023



During the last week of June, we conducted the four-day Tactical Paramedic training for the year. This training consists of three components, which comprise four days of content. The students are all members of local tactical teams from various agencies. The participants were mostly new team members or those who may have missed last year's training.

The first component was held at Tampa's Center for Advanced Medical Learning and Simulation (CAMLS). CAMLS is a part of USF and provides top-notch training for healthcare professionals. During their time at CAMLS, the students received instruction on several procedures specifically allowed by the tactical medic. The highlight of the training is when the students practice these specialty procedures on actual tissue from individuals who have donated their bodies to education. Due to the sensitive nature of this portion of the program, we did not take any pictures.

The second component is the two-day Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) NAEMT course. This class was held at the Largo Center for Prehospital Medicine (CPM). During this class, the students learned the skills of care under fire. There was time spent in the air-conditioned classroom and outside in the Florida heat. Students had to wear all their ballistic and medical gear to add difficulty to the outside exercises.

The final component was a practical application of all the newly learned skills. This event is held at night to add another level of difficulty. The evening started with a guest speaker. Dr. Brown came to teach the students how to care for injured K-9s. Dr. Brown is a veterinarian who regularly teaches care for working dogs. She brought several furry adjunct instructors to help the students practice as realistically as possible. These dogs were accommodating and allowed our students to practice several assessment skills.

After the instruction from Dr. Brown and a dinner break, the students were divided into teams and led by several instructors to four separate scenarios. While the details of the scenarios are kept relatively quiet, they may have included load noises, flashing lights, strenuous exercise, complete darkness, and OC spray. Despite the difficulty level, we had a 100% completion rate for the week.

A big thank you to all those who helped make this week a huge success. Thank you to Lt. Lance Michael and Chief Kyle Lighthiser for their efforts as the lead instructors.

He spent many years as the driver engineer on Engine 66 and worked on the department's Hazardous Materials Team. Ron was an active member of the Honor Guard and in his tenure placed the wreath on the Tomb of the Unknown Solider; an enormous honor held by few. 
