

On February 14th, Palm Harbor Fire Rescue's E66 crew found themselves in the right place at the right time. While teaching hands-only CPR at the YMCA, the fire alarm went off. The building was quickly evacuated, and PHFR's dedicated crews efficiently solved the problem. The cause was the Heat Detector connected to the Fire Alarm panel signaling higher temperatures in an electrical closet. Their Thermal Imaging Camera (TIC) confirmed the box at 125° F. Further checking revealed blocked vents as the reason for the high temperature. CPR education triumphs once again! We extend our heartfelt thanks to everyone involved.

Established in 2020, the First Responder Hope Line employs retired or former first responder peers as care coordinators who are trained to listen without judgement and provide emotional support. In 2022, the Crisis Center received additional funding to hire a First Responder Ambassador, Retired Asst. Chief Meg Ross, who is working to increase awareness of the line and reduce the stigma associated with seeking behavioral health resources throughout the 11-county coverage area from Pasco to Collier County.

The Suncoast Alliance for First Responders (SAFR) was also established to bring together first responder leaders and community partners to create a strategic plan to address the barriers and gaps to behavioral health resources in the Tampa Bay area. The SAFR has completed a strategic plan, R.E.A.L. Hope for First Responders and will be meeting in January to put this plan into action.
