Continual Compliance to Continuing Medical Education

Having been an EMT since 1984 and a Paramedic since 1986, I've been to a lot of wallet card classes and a lot of CME classes over the years!

I know when I had young kids and competing priorities, I attended more than my share of make-up CMEs – I get it.

I know that it is a burden to fit into your already busy professional and personal lives, but, it is essential that as a public safety professional you attend all Continuing Medical Education within the prescribed time and keep up all of your certifications without lapse.

There have been a small number of recent cases of EMTs and Paramedics getting into trouble by not maintaining their ACLS card, not renewing their State License in a timely manner, or not attending Continuing Medical Education (online or classroom) in the primary month.

After working so hard to build a career and jump through all of the hoops to become an EMT or Paramedic, it is very surprising that we see clinicians put their County Certification at risk.

Just some quick reminders:

Most agencies require you to maintain County Certification to keep your job.

Not attending CME, results in immediate Clinical Suspension.

If you don't attend CME classes in a timely manner, you are subject to an Administrative Proceeding that can conclude with Restriction, Suspension or Revocation of County Certification.

Training and quality assurance review records follow you if you change agencies within Pinellas County

Training and discipline records could be used against you in the case of a medical malpractice lawsuit

Many issues have mandatory reporting requirements to the Florida Department of Health that can impact your license

Medical Control Directives need to be read and acknowledged in a timely manner

Same with any In-Service and Safety Alerts – the expectation is that they are viewed and completed within the timeframe given which can be "immediately" depending upon the situation.

I know it is a tough job and appreciate the pressures and time constraints, but please attend training in the month it is given and keep up your wallet cards.

If you attend CME and keep up your wallet cards you are part of the mass majority – thank you!






Pinellas Park High School Disaster Day

St. Petersburg Clearwater International Airport Emergency Preparedness Drill





On April 11th, Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighters and Clearwater Fire Rescue, Largo Fire Rescue, Pinellas Park Fire Rescue, St. Petersburg Fire Rescue, and Sunstar EMS participated in the St. Petersburg Clearwater International Airport Emergency Preparedness Drill. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requires that all certified commercial service airports conduct a full-scale emergency exercise every three years to assess their emergency response capabilities in the event of an actual air disaster. The drill scenario involved a commercial passenger aircraft experiencing a simulated crash landing on RWY4-22.





NARCAN TRAINING!

On May 3, 2023 over 100 Pinellas County Park Rangers received training in Narcan administration and suspected opioid overdose response tactics by the Pinellas County EMS Office of the Medical Director. This was an important next step in the county's efforts to respond to the Opioid Crisis occurring in our communities.











City of Seminole Fire Rescue

This week the City of Seminole Fire Rescue Department has been training the department on our new Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBAs). Our previous air packs are reaching the end of their useful life and were in need of replacement. A committee was formed and SCBAs from several different companies were tested in many environments and situations. At the end of the trials, a system was chosen, recommended to Fire Administration and ultimately approved by our City Council.

This training was performed by members of our Training Division covering the use, care, maintenance, emergency procedures, mask fit testing, updated communication equipment and the many new options that will ultimately make the scenes we encounter safer for our firefighters.







Morgan Pyle, Application Analyst Safety & Emergency Services

On behalf of Pinellas County Safety and Emergency Services, I had the opportunity to present a new data solution at the ESRI Southeast Conference.

The new Address Data Management Solution streamlines the collection and maintenance of an address repository used by a variety of information systems. The solution includes content defined by several national guidelines, and provides tools to validate, maintain, and improve the integrity of data. As part of the presentation, we discussed two project drivers that involve Safety and Emergency Services, like transitioning to NextGen-911 and implementing the consolidated CAD.

There was high interest in our county relating to addressing with 24 different authorities, population compared to size, and overall function of Police, Fire, and EMS.

Overall, it was a great experience.


