### **Hurricane Idalia**

In the wake of Hurricane Idalia, we want to shine a spotlight on our remarkable Fire/EMS personnel and 911 dispatch team. Their dedication and tireless efforts were the guiding light during the storm's darkest hours.

These heroes worked tirelessly, putting their own safety at risk to rescue and aid those in need. They were away from their loved ones, working long hours, and serving our community with unwavering commitment.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all who were on duty during and after Hurricane Idalia. Your courage and compassion exemplify true heroism, and we are profoundly grateful for your service.

To highlight some remarkable statistics that reflect their dedication and the challenges they faced:

**Pinellas County Regional 9-1-1:** Answered over 800 calls from Tuesday, Aug. 29, at 7 p.m. through Wednesday, Aug. 30, at 5 p.m.

**Fire/EMS Responded to:** 63 evacuation calls and water rescues, 47 structure fires, 10 unconfirmed structure fires, and 4 gas leaks.

5 State Ambulance Strike Teams (a total of 25 Ambulances) assisted in evacuating Hospitals; they transported 99 patients.

During the storm week, **Sunstar** evacuated hospital and special needs patients, responded to storm-related incidents, and brought evacuees back afterward. They transported a total of 2,695 patients, with the busiest day being Thursday, August 31st, post-Hurricane, with 638 transports. Additionally, **Fire Departments** handled 4,526 calls during the same week.

On behalf of the Pinellas County EMS & Fire Administration, and the Pinellas County Office of the Medical Director, we extend special thanks to all who were working during and after Hurricane Idalia, away from their loved ones, and in ongoing service during this challenging time. Your labor of love for our community did not go unnoticed, and we are grateful for your service.



# SEPTEMBER 11, 2001 NEVER FORGET





# Yellow Dot and Vial of Life"





Pinellas County's Yellow Dot and Vial of Life programs alert first responders to your critical healthcare needs when you are seriously injured and cannot communicate that information yourself. The brochure now includes emergency pet care contact information that will enable Animal Services to contact a caregiver for your pet during an emergency. Making this information available could help save your life and the life of your pet.

All you need to do is <u>request a kit</u> and place an information packet in your vehicle's glove compartment and on your refrigerator at home. The kit comes with decals for your vehicle and front door so first responders know you are a participant.

Your participation will help first responders:

- Identify who you are.
- Determine if you have a pre-existing medical condition that may inhibit you from communicating.
- Ensure that your current medications and pre-existing medical conditions are considered during decisions made about your treatment.
  - Enable Animal Services to contact a caregiver for your pet during an emergency.

So far over 23,000 kits have been distributed!
