As in the Days of Noah

Have you heard the phrase "as in the days of Noah"? If you ask people, their responses might be "I don't know" or "I don't care." This unfamiliarity or indifference is concerning, as there are specific topics we can't afford to be ignorant or apathetic about. No one wants to be caught unprepared when Jesus raptures His church or when He returns at the second coming. Matthew **24:37-38:** "For the coming of the Son of Man will be just like the days of Noah. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark." Jesus explained to His disciples what would occur at the end of the age. Using His title, "Son of Man," as prophesied in Daniel 7:13–14, Jesus asserts His authority as the rightful King over all, stating that when the Son of Man returns, it will be similar to the days of Noah. During that time, people were living their everyday lives, totally unaware of the impending judgment until it struck, as highlighted in Matthew 24:39: "... they did not understand until the flood came and took them all away; so will the coming of the Son of Man be."
