A survey revealed that college students are increasingly opting for philosophy courses to understand the world because contemporary thinkers and leaders do not provide clear answers, leading them to study the supposed wisdom of writers from centuries past. Every Christian understands that only one ancient text remains forever relevant: the Bible. **Psalm 118:8-9** tells us, "It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in people. It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in noblemen." Those who trust in government, finances, other people, or themselves will end up disappointed. Conversely, the Scripture tells us that those who place their confidence in God will never be ashamed. Romans 10:11: "As Scripture says, Anyone who believes in Him will never be put to shame."
