

Your Salvation

Salvation has always come through faith in Christ, the only mediator. Salvation is rooted in the eternal plan made by the persons of the Trinity: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. King Solomon tells us, **Ecclesiastes 3:11**: *“He has made everything beautiful in its time. Also, He has put eternity into man’s heart, yet so that he cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end.”* Eternity resides within us. **Ecclesiastes 3:1-2**: *“There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be born and a time to die...”* The question for us is: *“Are you ready to meet God?”* **Hebrews 9:27**: *“And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment.”* The Bible clearly teaches, from Genesis to Revelation, that this life is only a preparation for eternal life. But remember, this is only the start of our real life in heaven, since earth is our temporary home. **1 John 5:13-15**: *“These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life. This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him”.* God wants His children to be confident in their salvation. He didn't save us so that we would spend our lives doubting whether it's real. No, He wants us to be sure. **Hebrews 10:23**: *“Let’s hold firmly to the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful.”* Jesus said that becoming a Christian is like experiencing a new birth. It's like being born a second time, the first being physical and the second spiritual. **1 John 5:13**: *“These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.”* If you've been born again, you have come to the Lord and said, *“Lord, I’m a sinner, I know You’re the Savior. I believe You’re the Son of God, and I want You to be my Savior. Please come into my life and forgive me of my sins”.* You've made a confession of faith. The Book of Romans says that if we confess with our mouth and believe in our heart, we will be saved. When you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior and receive Him into your life, something happens—you change. You're being transformed, not merely reformed. If it were a reformation, it would come from the outside in. No, transformation is from the inside out because Jesus Christ now dwells within you. When He comes to live inside, He makes you into a different person. You will understand this when you give your life to Christ, because He sends the Holy Spirit to dwell in your heart. You are saved for eternity. Rest in your salvation.
