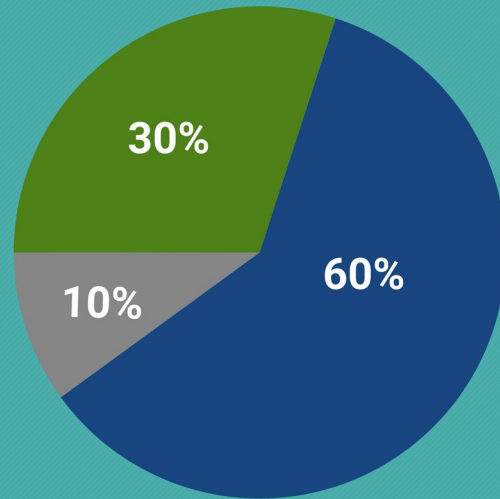

BEFORE STORM SEASON

MAKE A PLAN

- WILL YOU EVACUATE?
- FRIEND OR FAMILY, SHELTERS, PET SHELTERS, VULNERABLE POPULATIONS
- GATHER AND PLAN TO TAKE SUPPLIES (RX, FOOD, WATER, SUPPLIES)

DO NOT set out tree trimming or other debris for collection when a storm is approaching!

SECURE YOUR HOME

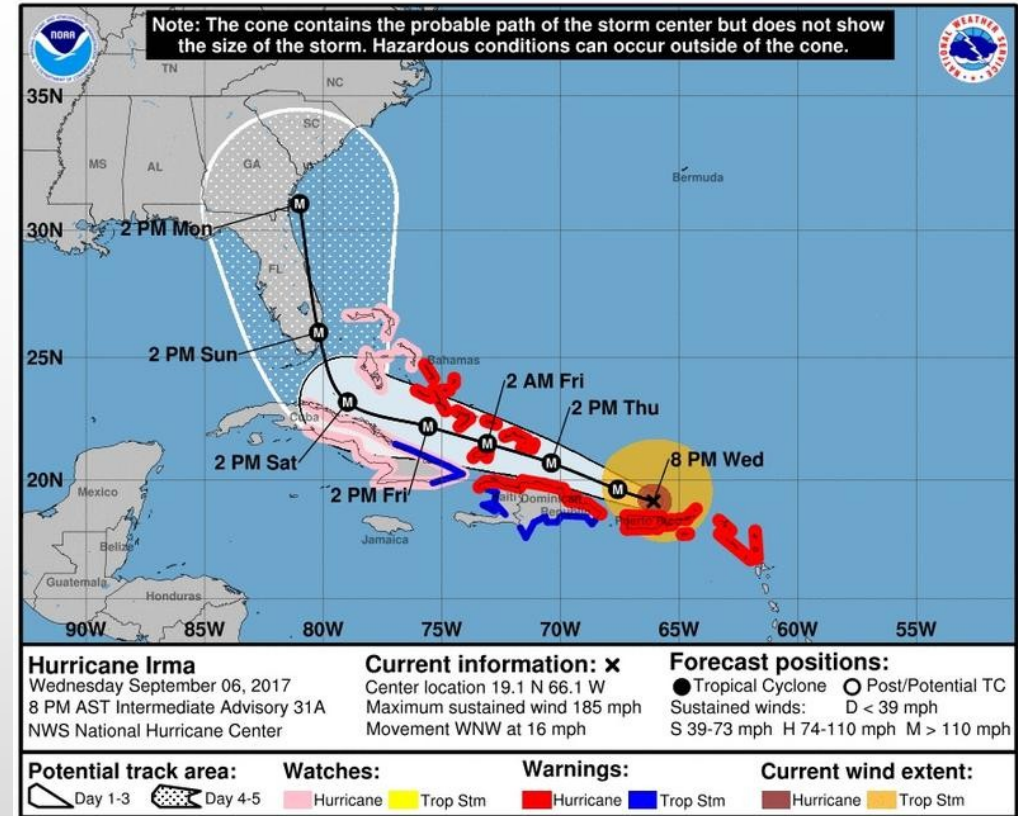
- CAREFULLY REVIEW YOUR INSURANCE COVERAGE
- INVENTORY, VIDEO OR PHOTOGRAPH ALL ITEMS OF VALUE
- TRIM TREES IN ADVANCE OF STORM SEASON; SHUTTERS, GENERATORS, ETC.

SHARE YOUR PLAN

- COMMUNICATE YOUR PLAN WITH MEMBERS OF YOUR IMMEDIATE FAMILY – INCLUDING CHILDREN
- LET FRIENDS OR FAMILY KNOW WHAT YOUR PLAN IS AND ESTABLISH AN OUT-OF-TOWN CONTACT

KNOW THE TERMINOLOGY

- HURRICANE WATCH – HURRICANE CONDITIONS POSSIBLE WITH 48 HOURS. PREPARATIONS SHOULD BE UNDERWAY
- HURRICANE WARNING – HURRICANE CONDITIONS ARE EXPECTED WITHIN 36 HOURS. RUSH PREPARATIONS TO COMPLETION



SAFFIR SIMPSON SCALE

Category	Wind Speed (mph)	Damage at Landfall
1	74-95	Minimal
2	96-110	Moderate
3	111-130	Extensive
4	131-155	Extreme
5	> 155	Catastrophic

DURING THE STORM

- STAY INDOORS – SAFE ROOM OR AWAY FROM WINDOWS AND EXTERIOR DOORS
- DO NOT GO OUTSIDE DURING THE EYE OF A STORM
- BE AWARE THAT TORNADOS MAY FORM – MONITOR LOCAL WEATHER
- LISTEN TO GUIDANCE FROM EMERGENCY MANAGERS



AFTER THE STORM



- REMAIN INSIDE UNTIL THE “ALL CLEAR” IS GIVEN
- TREAT ALL DOWNED POWER LINES AS “LIVE”
- DO NOT WALK THROUGH STANDING WATER
- DO NOT DRIVE UNLESS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY
- IF YOU HAVE DAMAGE, TAKE STEPS TO PREVENT FURTHER DAMAGE AND CONTACT YOUR INSURANCE CARRIER
- TAKE PHOTOS/VIDEO OF DAMAGE

DEBRIS REMOVAL

- FIRST PUSH TO CLEAR MAJOR PUBLIC ROADWAYS; PICKUP OF FIRST PUSH DEBRIS TO FOLLOW WHEN EQUIPMENT IS AVAILABLE
- PRIOR TO DEBRIS REMOVAL IN PRIVATE COMMUNITIES, A FINDING BY THE CITY MANAGER THAT DEBRIS, (I) POSES AN IMMEDIATE THREAT TO THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC IN THE AREA, (II) POSES AN IMMEDIATE THREAT OF SIGNIFICANT DAMAGE TO SURROUNDING IMPROVED PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY, OR (III) TO REQUIRE REMOVAL TO PROVIDE AN ECONOMIC BENEFIT TO THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE
- FIRST PUSH INTO RESIDENTIAL (PUBLIC AND PRIVATE) COMMUNITIES; PICKUP OF FIRST PUSH DEBRIS TO FOLLOW WHEN EQUIPMENT IS AVAILABLE



DEBRIS REMOVAL - CONTINUED

- REGULAR “BULK” COLLECTION MAY BE SUSPENDED FOLLOWING THE STORM – RESIDENTS WILL BE NOTIFIED WHEN IT RESUMES
- STORM DEBRIS SHOULD NOT BE CO-MINGLED WITH REGULAR “BULK”

YOUR CLEANUP AFTER THE STORM
A residential guide for post-storm debris collections

Keep it Manageable
Follow these guidelines when putting out your debris for a speedier clean-up. Place all debris and carts at the curb separated and in a neat pile for collection, as shown below.

Do NOT Stack Debris
Avoid stacking against trees, poles, fences, fire hydrants, mailbox, downed wires or storm drains.

Place Debris on Swale
Debris not placed on swale or at the curb will not be collected. Do not place debris on the sidewalk or in the street.

Do NOT Place Hazardous Waste on Swale
These items will NOT be collected.

Regular Household Garbage/Recyclables
Place regular household garbage in green cart. Place recyclable materials in blue cart. Place carts at the curb for collection.
NOTE: Announcement will be made when these services have resumed.

Bulk Waste/ Structural Debris

- Building Material
- Plumbing
- Drywall
- Lumber
- Carpet
- Furniture
- Mattresses

Vegetative Debris

- Logs
- Shrubs
- Stumps
- Palm Fronds
- Tree Branches

Appliances

- Refrigerators/Freezers (emptied and all doors removed or secured)
- Air Conditioners
- Washers/Dryers
- Water Heaters
- Dishwashers
- Stoves

Electronics

- Printers
- Stereos
- Televisions
- Computers
- Telephones
- DVD Players
- Other Devices

Household Hazardous Waste
NOTE: Take to Residential Drop-Off Center

- Tires
- Motor Oil
- Pesticides
- Propane Tanks
- Paints/Solvents
- Lawn Chemicals
