

In southern Patagonia, hike through rugged landscapes and experience the majestic Patagonian steppe, with its sub-Antarctic forests and volcanic terrain. Along the way, encounter wildlife, from flamingos in the Atacama to Magellanic penguins on Magdalena Island, before delving into the volcanic heart of Pali Aike National Park. This unforgettable expedition combines adventure, science, and nature, offering a unique opportunity to explore Patagonia's most awe-inspiring geological features.

Join us for this once-in-a-lifetime experience, perfect for those with a passion for the Earth's raw beauty, unique flora and fauna, and dynamic landscapes.

## **ABOUT THE TOURS**

A guided tour of Patagonia with expert geologists offers an unparalleled opportunity to connect with the region's stunning landscapes on a deeper level. As you explore everything from ancient lava fields to towering granite peaks, your guides will provide context and insights that transform each hike and visit into an immersive learning experience. Beyond just sightseeing, you'll gain a richer understanding of the Earth's dynamic processes, making this adventure both intellectually rewarding and visually spectacular.

These tours are designed for those interested in Patagonia's unique landscapes, with no prior geology knowledge required. Before departure, Dr. Jovanelly will provide introductory videos and reading materials on key geological concepts (e.g., volcanism, tectonics, glaciers, fjords) to build your foundational knowledge, preparing you for more advanced discussions during the trip.

# **SAMPLE ITINERARY**

Day 1: Arrival in the Atacama Desert Arrive at Calama Airport and transfer to San Pedro de Atacama, the gateway to the Atacama Desert. After settling in, enjoy a light activity such as a stroll through town to acclimate to the altitude. Get to know your fellow travelers at our welcome reception and group dinner.

Book a 14-day excursion

- Day 2: Salt Mountain Range & Atacama Salt Flats Explore the Salt Mountain Range, a unique landscape of salt, gypsum, and clay deposits, featuring striking natural sculptures, caves, and ridges. Later, visit Laguna Chaxa in the Atacama Salt Flats, home to flamingos and other bird species.
- Day 3: El Tatio Geysers & Astronomical Night Early departure to El Tatio Geysers, one of the world's highest geyser fields. Explore over 80 active geysers and fumaroles, with views of nearby volcanoes. On the way, stop at lagoons and wetlands to observe flamingos. In the evening, enjoy stargazing in one of the clearest skies on Earth.
- Day 4: Travel to the Los Rios Region Fly from Calama to Santiago, connect to Valdivia, a city known for lush forests and seismic history.
- **Day 5: Valdivia Exploration:** Explore Valdivia, learning about the 1960 Great Chilean Earthquake and its dramatic impact on the rivers and wetlands. A boat trip through the region's waterways offers a firsthand view of these changes.
- Day 6: Volcanoes of the Lake District Travel through the Lake District, focusing on volcanic landscapes shaped by the subduction of the Nazca Plate. Visit the towering Osorno Volcano and enjoy stunning views of its surrounding area.
- Day 7: Osorno Volcano & Petrohué Falls Visit Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park to explore Osorno Volcano and picturesque Petrohué Falls. The falls, framed by volcanic rocks, offer a breathtaking sight.
- Day 8: Calbuco Volcano Hike Hike the south face of Calbuco Volcano, one of Patagonia's most active volcanoes, and explore lava formations and ancient forests. At the summit, enjoy panoramic views of the surrounding landscapes.
- Day 9: Travel to Southern Patagonia & Puerto Natales Fly to Puerto Natales, entering the heart of southern Patagonia. Explore the Patagonian steppe, wetlands, and fjords. In the afternoon, enjoy a walk around town and the waterfront.
- **Day 10:** Torres del Paine National Park Spend the day exploring Torres del Paine National Park, with hikes through valleys and glacial lakes beneath the towering granite spires of the Torres del Paine massif. Admire rock formations shaped by millions of years of geological activity.
- Day 11: Torres del Paine National Park Continue exploring Torres del Paine, with opportunities to learn about the region's biodiversity and geology. Visit new areas within the park, including viewpoints and pristine environments.
- Day 12: Punta Arenas & Penguin Colony Drive from Puerto Natales to Punta Arenas and take a half-day excursion to Magdalena Island in the Strait of Magellan. Visit the largest colony of Magellanic penguins in Chile and learn about their unique ecosystem.
- Day 13: Pali Aike National Park Explore Pali Aike National Park, a region of volcanic craters, extensive lava fields, and stark, lunar-like landscapes. The park offers a fascinating look at the volcanic past.
- **Day 14: Return to Santiago** After a final breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight back to Santiago and then home.
