St. Valentíne's Day

According to the Encyclopedia Britannica, our St. Valentine's Day got it origins from the Roman holiday of fertility known as the *Lupercalia*¹. The *Lupercalia* was an early celebration of the *lupa* or she-wolf that found Romulus and Remus as babies abandoned by the Tiber River. The *lupa* brought them back to her den on the Palatine hill and suckled them until they were found and raised by a shepherd, Faustulus. According to legend the twin brothers would later found Rome, named for Romulus. The date coincided with the breeding season of sheep and goats in mid-February. The festival began with an animal sacrifice (unfortunately), and patrician young men, in simple loincloth, would run around with Palatine hill lashing strips of the animal pelt. Women believed being touched by the pelts would bring them fertility in the coming year². It was indeed a strange custom but so ancient that the Roman senate never censored its practice and the date of the holiday has been handed down as St. Valentine's.



In the 5th century Pope Gelasius I renamed *Lupercalia* as *St. Valentine* in honor of a 3rd century Christian martyred by the Emperor Claudius II Gothicus³. Cupid, the Roman god of love, is often associated with Valentine's day, which is appropriate in that Cupid's father was Mars, the god of war and father of Romulus and Remus, and Venus, the goddess of love and mother of Aeneas a Trojan War hero from whom ancient Romans also claimed their lineage. The winged Cupid has always been depicted as a young child or even a babe, deceptively naïve, whose arrows (from his father Mars) were dipped in a potion to make anyone fall in love instantly.

The *lupa* is ubiquitous in Rome today; one can find it on all official seals, public works, and even Italian postage stamps. However, St. Valentine's day is celebrated more today in the USA and UK than in Rome, from whose name we derive the very word *romance*! Whether you spend February 14th with friends or loved ones, I hope this factoid will help you better appreciate the day steeped in rich history.
