What you see today is normal. Check twice a day for redness, swelling or discharge.

(The small, green tattoo indicates spayed or neutered.)

Keep females away from un-neutered males.

Feed a Simple Diet

Do not give your pet junk food, special treats, table scraps or milk.

No Human Medication!

It is dangerous & can be fatal! Your pet has already received long-acting pain medication.

Contact us immediately if you notice:

Pale gums; depression; problems walking; loss of appetite or decreased water intake; vomiting; diarrhea; heavy discharge or bleeding from the incision; difficuy with urination or bowel movements; difficuy breathing.
