Maui Food Bank jumped into action immediately after the fires. In the first ten days, we sent 250,000 pounds of food to people affected by this disaster. To date we have distributed 1.3 million pounds of food, including 250,000 pounds of fresh produce. We will continue to work diligently with our partner agencies, places of worship, local businesses, and community groups as we all respond to the need.

Looking ahead, we anticipate a significant increase in the demand for our services. Your support is more vital than ever before, given the magnitude of this crisis and the work ahead.



## On August 8, 2023, our lives changed forever!

Wildfires swept through our island community, causing loss of loved ones, homes, cultural historic sites, and businesses. Across the island, we are still learning about the impact of the fires. We are still grieving and just beginning the long road to recovery.

## Lives were lost, making these fires our nation's deadliest in the past 100 years.

- In West Maui, Lahaina sustained devasting damage. FEMA estimates that 2,170 acres burned
  and more than 2,200 structures were damaged or destroyed. Experts project that it will cost at least \$5.5 billion to rebuild Lahaina—and take years.
- · The community of Kula sustained significant damage as well.

The impact of the wildfires has been island-wide. About 75% of our economy depends on tourism, which has been severely disrupted—and completely halted in some places. People are losing their jobs, with additional rounds of layoffs expected. Small businesses are struggling and even closing after years of operations. Families are losing income, with little prospect of catching up. Across Maui, families are facing catastrophic financial challenges and uncertainty about the future. Recovery and return to our vibrant economy will take years.
