THE 12 TRAITS

1. Responsibility

Confident kids take ownership of their actions.

Parent Tip:

Give your child small responsibilities daily and praise follow-through.

2. Discipline

Success comes from consistent habits.

Parent Tip:

Create simple routines (homework, chores, bedtime).

3. Focus

Where focus goes, energy flows.

Parent Tip:

Limit distractions and encourage single-task focus.

4. Courage

Confidence grows through action.

Parent Tip:

Encourage your child to try things that feel uncomfortable.

5. Respect

Respect builds strong relationships.

Parent Tip:

Model respectful communication at home.

6. Perseverance

Confident kids don't quit.

Parent Tip:

Praise effort, not just results.

7. *Leadership*

Leaders influence through action.

💡 **Parent Tip:**

Encourage your child to help others.

8. *Self-Control*

Calm mind = strong decisions.

💡 **Parent Tip:**

Teach pause → think → respond.

9. *Gratitude*

Grateful kids are happier kids.

💡 **Parent Tip:**

Ask: “What are you thankful for today?”

10. Growth

“I can’t do it... yet.”

💡 **Parent Tip:**

Reframe failure as learning.

11. Integrity

Do the right thing always.

💡 **Parent Tip:**

Reward honesty, even when it’s hard.

12. Legacy

Strong kids help others grow.

💡 **Parent Tip:**

Encourage mentorship and kindness.



Where Is Your Child Right Now?

- Do they try new things confidently?
