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# My Story

In 2006, I was on a mission's trip to Chennai, India with three other ministers of the gospel. We traveled throughout the southern parts of India from the west coast back to the east coast in a 14-day period. The main instructions we were given were not to eat or drink the local cuisine out of concern that our bodies would not be able to handle the food and water.

For the first thirteen days, we experienced signs, wonders and miracles. We saw many people give their lives to the Lord, healed and delivered. Throughout the trip, I kept hearing how good the local coffee was where we were staying. I had a crazy idea that you have to boil water to make coffee and I convinced myself by boiling the water it would have killed any bacteria that could have harmed me. I indulged myself with one of the most delicious cups of coffee I have ever had.

When I woke up the next morning, I felt like I was hit by a freight train. My temperature was 104 degrees, and it was hard for me to keep my eyes open. This was the last day we were to do ministry, and we were expecting a large crowd of Pastors who were waiting with expectation. After the ministers I was with prayed for me, I felt a little better and told them to go, and I would stay in the room and rest. As soon as they left the room, it was as if a freight train backed up and ran over me again. I was so hot that I got in the shower, ran cold water and laid on the floor. Because the showers there were all made of marble, it kept my temperature from going higher. I must have been in the shower for about an hour or so. When I came out and dried off, this is where things got strange.

In a state of delusion, I started to see objects floating around the room. Not able to stand, I laid in the bed and tried to calm myself. The only thing I could remember from this time period is that I heard a voice say "draw." I do not remember drawing anything or even grabbing my notepad but when the others returned, I was fast asleep. When I woke up, I told them about my experience and how I heard the voice instruct me to draw. Oddly enough, my drawing pad was on the bed next to me and when I opened it, there was a detailed mural of every place we had been in the past thirteen days. Every encounter, every mode of transportation and every service was in this drawing. At this point, I felt great.

On returning to the States, everything was fine, and I had a clean bill of health. My life in ministry continued as usual. The first Sunday returning to church service, I remember the minister preaching, and I was writing notes as I usually did. When my wife and I returned home, we started discussing the service. She asked me if we could compare notes because she felt like she missed a point. When she looked at my notebook, all she found were lines and lines of unreadable scribble. At this point, I was baffled because I surely remember writing words as the service was going on. I remember writing down the chapters and verses the preacher ministered from and the key points he made from each verse. To my surprise none of it was in the book. This activity continued between my wife and I for three weeks. There were times that I specifically took my time to write words only to find more scribble. At this point, I told my wife, "I might as well record the service seeing how I can't write."

A week or so after this, I remembered our pastor preaching from the Book of Isaiah 6. This is the chapter that describes the Seraphims. Verse 2 talks about how the Seraphim had six wings and how with two of them he covered his face, and with two of them he covered his feet, and with two of them he flew. When he began reading this verse, out of nowhere, I could see this creature standing in the pulpit behind him and to my shock, I was frozen with my eyes fixed in one location. I sat on the edge of my seat in amazement and looked around to see if anyone else was reacting to this sight. My wife tried to get me to sit back in my seat because she said I was being distractive. After all, we were sitting in the front row. Again, I heard the same voice that I heard in India say "draw", so I opened my book and began to draw this Seraphim.

What stood out in my mind about this encounter was that I remember saying out loud, "Their wings do bend". As many times as I read this scripture before, I never understood how he could get his wings in front of his face. When we returned home that evening, we discussed this encounter in detail, and I was able to recall almost every word that was said during the sermon even though my focus was on drawing the Seraphim.

Ever since that day when someone ministers the word of God, I am given images and scenes of activity. Each image in this book was drawn in the time period where a person ministered the gospel. When they stop speaking, the images go away. When someone preaches the gospel of Jesus Christ, I literally see what he or she is saying.

God recently put on my heart to create a coloring book of these images. This book would be something people could use to meditate on and may be used as a devotional. God then instructed us to write exactly a one-thousand-word description for each picture. Each writing in this book is exactly one thousand words. This is where the title of the book comes from, "Kingdom Colors in a thousand words".

Father God we ask in the name of Jesus, all boundaries, all blockages and any negativity spoken in the past of this person is removed. Anything that hinders the Kingdom of God from reaching this person is removed as he or she connects with this book. As each passage is read that accompanies each drawing, this person will become stronger and stronger in You. They will get a revelation of their purpose and what he or she was made for. You made each and every one of us on purpose God.

Father God, we thank you that healing will take place and physical ailments will be removed as people understand Your love as described and illustrated in this book. Father God, we thank you that miracle healings will take place. We thank you that physical healing will take place as the people take the time to color the pictures and reflect on the words that go along with them.

Father God, we thank you that deliverance will take place during this journey. Anything that is trying to hinder Your people will be removed, and they will be delivered in the name of Jesus. We thank you that people will find salvation in this book.

We thank you God that people will find a closer relationship with You, and they will understand the importance of the Christ that is in them. We decree they will learn to walk with boldness and understand all things are possible with Christ. We ask that their faith be strengthened not wavering and will be on fire for You.

We thank you as they read these pages and go through the colorings of this book, Holy Spirit will speak to them. We ask now God that you open their ears and give them a clear understanding for when Holy Spirit speaks; His voice will become loud in their life.

God, we thank you because You know this book is anointed, and we know it has been touched by heaven. As Your precious child goes through this book, we thank you for giving Your child the strength, understanding, power, and tools to conquer the world. We thank you for showing them how to boldly march through any situation that will try to hinder their relationship with You. You are the conqueror of all lions from the tribe of Judah.

We thank you God and ask that you bless them in Jesus name.

# Releasing the Glory

Releasing the Glory is a straightforward concept. When you think of it, you think of releasing birds back into the wild or fish back into the sea. This is a drawing that takes place just before Mary and the other women came to the grave of Jesus Christ.

In the Bible, it gives us the account of the women walking to His tomb and the Angel meeting them there. The famous statement of the Angel is "What do you seek here?" Sometimes in our lives, we go with the expectation of something grim. We already formulated what the outcome is going to be in our mind when we get there, but in this case, it is nothing what the women expected. What they expected to see was a giant stone blocking the entrance of the tomb, sealing Jesus in, for what they knew would be eternity. The angel was sitting on top of the stone at the exposed entrance, and it surprised them.

This picture is a depiction of what happened moments before the women arrived. Jesus came for a reason so the anointing, and the glory would be delivered to mankind. When the Angel rolled the stone away to let Jesus physically walk out, the Glory of God was physically released with Him so all men would have access to the anointing "within."

I believe this was the start of the saying, "Christ in you, the hope of Glory". Could you imagine seeing the sight of the heavenly host gather around Jesus as he emerged from the tomb and all heaven rejoicing? Again, this is what I saw when God was showing me this picture. What do you see as you color it in? Do you see the Glory coming off him? Do you see the Glory coming through the clouds from the throne of Heaven? As you go through this book, every picture is an image that God showed me, but I don't want you to believe what I believe, I want you to see what God shows you.

As we look at the picture, let me describe it from top to bottom. At the very top, we see the throne of God where everything begins. His glory is light: emitting downward over the scene. The top row, I would call them the Arch Angels. The ones who guard the glory, ones like Michael, Gabriel, Raphael, Uriel, and Raguel.

Beneath them are some of the heavenly hosts. These are the angels who carry out the day to day activities heaven oversees. We are told in the Bible that when Jesus was tempted, He said that He could call on a legion of Angels. The word legion is a number that represents roughly 5120 soldiers. When the glory was released, each believer also gained command over a legion his or herself. We don't ask God to release the Angels that are in our charge because many of us don't believe we are worthy of such a command. But I know for sure, the Book of Psalms says He has given Angels in our charge who will guide us and assist us in whatever we need. I don't know about you, but I'm going to use every one of them to accomplish the things that God has for me.

At the bottom, I see an Angel rolling away the sealing stone of the tomb. The interesting thing about this is his position. It's as if the rock is shielding him from the awesome power of the Glory being released. I believe, at least for this picture, that when the women came to the tomb, this Angel is the one they encountered, as he was resting from the ordeal he just undertook. It was him who asked, "Who do you seek here?"

In the middle, and the star of the show, we see Jesus stepping out of the tomb preceding the anointing, and the rays of the Glory shooting in all directions. At that moment, the whole world was covered by His glory. All we need to do is accept Him as our Lord and Savior and the Christ in "you" will be activated.

Paul said, "Whereof I am made a minister, according to the dispensation of God which is given to me for you, to fulfill the word of God; *Even* the mystery which hath been hid from ages and from generations, but now is made manifest to his saints: To whom God would make known what *is* the riches of the Glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of Glory,"

I really like what he is saying; it speaks to me in a very calming way. His words remind me that I have been made for a reason and when I was made, everything was put in me from the start. The Glory He speaks of is the anointing that is the Power of God. The word "Christ" means anointing or anointed. I could stop there at just knowing the power of God is in me, but to know it has always been there is amazing to me. You should know the same anointing or Power of God is in you too.

Paul said there was a dispensation that was given to him which at some point belonged to God. See, God had a certain time in mind when He was going to release this information. God waited for Paul to release this information that was a mystery to generations before him. Now that the information is out, it is something we all are supposed to walk in. We are supposed to have a sure belief that this Power is not only in us but is active and working.

So, you see, Jesus did come to earth to save us from our sins and cover us with the blood. I believe His primary mission was to restore and ignite to Glory in us.



This picture brings to mind the story of Ezekiel in the valley of dry bones. The story starts out with Ezekiel saying, "The hand of the Lord is upon me"; I find this a very good place to be. Even though this person in the picture looks like he or she is torn to pieces, he or she is still in a good position because the hand of the Lord is still on them. It is when we find ourselves in pieces without God that life becomes overwhelming and too much for our small minds to bear. But faith knows God has a plan and no matter how messy it may look; His plan is always to restore every piece that is out of place.

Looking at the sky, it seems like a cloudy day, but can you identify the figures that are hidden in the clouds? When you start to see one, you'll find another and another as a reminder that heaven is always looking and watching over us.

Let's examine this image a little closer. We see a person in pieces; we see a hand helping him out, and there are figures in the clouds. We equated this image with Ezekiel in the valley; my question is, did this person get himself there or did God put him there?

When we are in a place that seems like a desert, we say God has forsaken or left us in this barren land. God knows where we are every second of our lives and He still said, "I will never forsake you or leave you". In Psalm 139, the writer stated, where can I go and be apart from Your spirit or where can I flee and be separated from Your presence? If I ascend unto heaven, You are there, and if I make my bed in hell, You will also be there.

As you color this picture, I ask you to meditate on this writing. Ask God, "Am I in a place where You can do something with me?" I pray no matter where you are, you will always ask God to keep His hand on you, because it is here where He will do His greatest work through you.

#### I Got You

How many times have you been in a situation that seemed so perilous that you just knew this was the end? God made us on purpose, not to stop when opposition comes, but to run through it and win the race.

All heaven is designed to aid us and to carry us through the unseen pitfalls in life and to strengthen us when we are weak and encourage us when we are weary. This is why God actually put the Christ in us so when we are in these situations that try to stop us, all we need to do is say, "God, we trust You" and that we know we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us.

This image speaks to me about a phrase we used to say when I was younger when you ran with your friends, you knew the ones who would always be there for you and would quote the phrase "I got your back". Are we living like we believe heaven has our back? If you knew that there is a host of heavenly angels waiting to step in on your behalf, would you be bolder in the things of God?

The angel is holding the young man in this picture and ushering him into the steps that he may not see, but the angel knows he cannot fall. Would you be willing to step out quicker? Would you be quicker to do what God tells you knowing that He would not let you fall? This is the kind of faith God is waiting on from us.

This picture has many elements to it. It speaks to the position that heaven is in. Psalm 91 says that God has given us charge over angels. This means they are waiting to aid us in the things we are doing for God and when we find ourselves on a cliff stepping out into the unknown, it actually says they hold us in their hands, so we won't even dash our foot on a stone.

The angels are paying such close attention to every move we make and every step we take to guide us toward heaven and the original plan God created for us. God knows He has a plan for us and so do the angels that are in our charge. It is up to us to get with the program and realize whose team we're on.

In the picture, there is a burst of light that seems to be in front of the young man across the path of unseen stones. This light represents the glory of God; by keeping our eyes on this light, we move from glory to glory as we step out on faith.

We do not often realize the plan or the paths that God has laid down for us. We have been raised to believe only what we can see. God is asking us to live out things that are not yet seen as though they have already appeared. Isn't this what the Bible tells us to do?

In 2 Corinthians 5:1, it talks about how the things that are seen are temporary. Often, these things are man-made which decay and breakdown after a while, but the things that are not seen are spiritual. When they are made by God, they last for eternity. God is asking us to not put our trust in the things that are man-made but trust the things that He made for us which will be with us for eternity.

My prayer, as you continue to color this image, is that you ask God about the things that He has for you. Where are the places He wants to take you and what other steps you should take?

I believe this is what God was truly after, for us to agree with heaven and come under one accord. When we see something in the world that we identify as a problem, heaven will identify it from the solution. When we look at a person and identify fear in that person, heaven has already acknowledged perfect love. It's as if God will tell us, "I can see perfect love in that person;" our response should be "So will I".

In God, everything is based on His perfect love. We are to mimic Him and follow the lead of Jesus. Jesus is not only our Lord and Savior, but He is a perfect coach and lifestyle trainer. Paul said, "Follow me as I follow Christ." If we're not following the example Jesus left us, we are not following a true Christian life. When Jesus said He would forgive a person seven times seventy, our response should be, "So will I". When Jesus said he has been anointed to set the captives free and bring sight to the blind and provide for the poor, our response should be "so will I." There are so many examples of what Jesus will do for us and our only response should be, "So will I". This is why Jesus said go into all the world and make disciples because this is exactly what he did, and again, if Jesus did this, "So will I".

On the left side, we have Bible scenes, and on the right, we have contemporary actions. Starting at the top left, the Bible often talks about different people and their level of worship to God. It talks about David and how God called him a friend for his worship. It speaks of Jesus and how every night, He went into a place alone to commune with the Father. On the right side is **YOU**. Are you willing to worship God unconditionally, to close yourself off and give Him your all? This is what He's waiting for. God said He's roaming the world looking for those who will worship.

The second image on the left is of Peter and John at the gate called Beautiful where they encountered a man who was lame from birth. This man sat at this one spot in front of the church every day and asked for money. But when he asked Peter and John, their response was different. Heaven said the man could walk when the rest of the world saw a lame person. Peter and John's response echoed what heaven saw. If heaven saw a healed man walking, their response was "So will I". They told the man to get up and walk, and he did. Are you looking at people from the world's perspective or even from their own low self-esteemed, self-projected point of view? Or are you looking from heaven's perspective and agreeing with heaven?

The third picture on the left is when Jesus fed the multitudes. I find this an interesting story because the Bible said that Jesus had compassion for the people. They were with Him all day, and He did not want them to walk away hungry. There was a long journey ahead of many of them. When he asked the disciples if they could feed the people, their first response was one of a lack of money. They said, "Master, it would take a half year salary to feed these people." This was a response from an earthly perspective and the disciples were right. The only thing they presented to Jesus was a little boy's lunch. The funny thing here is that their minds went from tens of thousands of dollars to pull this off to presenting Jesus with a \$5.00 lunchbox. The book of John says Jesus brought order to the crowd and gave thanks, feeding five thousand men. This count was not including the women and children who were there, but it did say, all who was there ate well.

On the right-hand side is a man helping the homeless. We often walk or drive by people who clearly need our help. The worldly side of us would say it might be a scam; the shoes this person has on are too clean for him or her to be homeless, or the woman sitting at the roadside is too well kept "to be" in despair. But if heaven identifies that person as a child of God, "So will I".

My prayer is, as you color this image, you think about your life and how it reflects or mimics the life of Christ. For some, you will be the only image of Christ they see. Will they see the Christ in you?

#### I Will With Filtered Love



Moving like He moves, acting like He acts, saying what He said. I remember a while ago, there was a catchy phrase, "What Would Jesus Do?" This just so happened to be around the time my Wife and I got saved. We would repeat this phrase thinking it was so holy. The fact is we should've been trying to do what Jesus did instead of wondering what would He do. We didn't have to wonder what He did because it's written in the Book. When we read what Jesus did, our only response should be "so will I". Jesus told us to do two things, first, is to love God with all that you are. Second, is to love people as you love yourself. The Bible says that God is love. When Jesus told His "Disciples" the world will know you by your love, what He was saying was, the world will identify you by how much you imitate God. Our impersonation of God should look like it's being filtered with His love.





### Filtered Love

When we think of the word "filter," we often use it in a way as if we are removing or separating two materials. We use coffee filters to separate solid pieces from liquid. Our gas tank has a fuel filter so large particles cannot flow into the engine, but in this image, this is not the case.

We are talking about a higher, more spiritual perspective than simple gas or coffee. We are talking about a divine kingdom approach to the cares of this world. When heaven looks at what we call problems, they are filtered through a perfect love. It is when we start learning how to use this love filter we will instantly call heaven to earth. What we are looking at is something coming from heaven going through a filter and being deposited in us. What God has created is complete and does not need anything removed; in fact, in this example, something is being added to what is passing through this filter.

In most of our images in this coloring book, you will often see a cube in the picture. For us, a cube represents the Glory or the Christ in you. With that being said, this image is about God releasing the Glory and adding perfect love and depositing it into you.

Paul mentioned he was made a minister for a "particular time" when people would know that there is a Christ in them also known as the hope of glory. What is in us have been so purified by the filters of heaven that if we operate in only ten percent of it, we would change the world. How much of the glory do you want to ignite? How much of God do you want to use? I'm trying to learn how to use the whole thing. The Bible instructs me to seek first the kingdom of God and its righteousness and everything will be added unto me. When I come across a person in need, I will immediately seek the kingdom of God and its righteousness, expecting everything that heaven has for this person to be released at that moment as long as it lines up with the Will of God.

So if Paul was instructed by God that now is the time for people to be aware of the Christ in them and the glory that comes with it, then when are we supposed to release it? Every time we find ourselves in adverse situations is a great opportunity to release the Glory. When we come across people who seem to be shutdown, release the Glory. When we come across people who are hurt, release the Glory. When we come across people who are under attack, release the Glory. This heaven-filtered love will overcome every situation, after all; it is the Christ in you.

Heaven sees every step we take and knows the desires of our hearts. Our genuineness is accounted for and the angels are always with us because they're assigned to intercede for us. We should be in a place in our lives where we should be comforted in knowing that our angels are with us every step of the way and are on assignment for us.

In Psalm 103:20, it speaks about a strength of the angels and how they listen and react to the voice of God and every word that is spoken. It is when God's language becomes our language, and we speak exactly what God speaks. We give God's word voice and activate the angels to their assignment for us. We are not placing the angels above the role of Jesus or the Holy Spirit in our lives. Jesus is our savior, and the Holy Spirit is our comforter and counselor, but Jesus also said that He was able to call legions of angels to help Him. This same authority was given to us for when we act in His name.

Let's look closer at this image; of course, the most noticeable feature is the hand of God. I think this is very important to remember because there are many places in the Bible that reference the hand of God. Jesus Himself said He has been "anointed" to teach the gospel. The word "anoint" means to smear or to rub on, and this can only happen with a hand. So what Jesus is actually saying is that the hand of God smeared His glory all over Him so that He would be able to carry out the plan of heaven for mankind.

In this image, we see the hand releasing the cube, which we explained is the Christ or the Glory of God. It splashes through what seems to be a liquid cloth that drops down to the person beneath embedding itself within him. This process is what Paul was speaking about. It was God who placed the Christ in you, and it was Jesus who came to reactivate it. Then Paul pronounced it is ready for you to use it. Jesus said that we would do more than Him. We are all going to be able to reach more people in our lifetime than He was able to reach in the three years He had for ministry. It is important that we always approach the world from the perspective of the Christ in us. When we do, they will always see His love.

The Bible talks about a daily grace. This is why we should often find ourselves in the posture of this person with hands raised and in the assumed positioned to be refilled or reenergized with the new glory for the day. It is in our worship where we move from glory to glory.

Jesus said the Kingdom is not on the outside, but on the inside of us. We speak a release and an activation of the hope of glory that resides in this person, so this person will walk boldly and confidently in Your Will.

Are you ready to place your angels on assignment?





# Angels On Assignment

You know, I've heard the phrase "hitting a glass ceiling" for a long time. Even before I got saved, I would hear people using this cliché to describe the status of their career, marriage, education, etc. Whatever they measured in increments of elevation hit this proverbial glass ceiling. I've come to learn this phrase implies that the person has reached their limit of advancement in their mind and there's no way up. Since I've been saved, I've heard this phrase even more. For some strange reason, Christians often use this to describe their prayer life. When I hear this, I can't help but picture words bouncing around the room. If we believe when we pray that our words never leave the ten-foot box, how can we believe they are affective?

God said, "I will never leave you or forsake you", this means God is literally standing with you and listening to every word that comes out of your mouth. His presence is always with you even as He sits in heaven. That alone should give you a clear understanding that there could never be a ceiling that blocks you from God. Jesus said, "My Father hears everything I say". We need to realize that God treats us the same way He treats Jesus. Just as God heard every word that came out of Jesus' mouth, do you think He's not listening as intently to your words?

To act like Christ, is to have His understanding of things and to see our position with God from His perspective. Psalm 91 talks about the angels in our charge and how their job is to care for us. Their position is to literally assist us on earth to bring things down from heaven so we can set up the very same things here. This is where the statement "Let it be on earth as it is in heaven" gets played out. We are to always ask for things from heaven's point of view and when we do this in the Will of the Father and in Jesus' name, the heavenly host is excited to carry out these commands.

Psalm 103 talks about how the angels harken to the voice of the Lord. If this is true, we cannot believe there is no one listening. We cannot give up on our expectations as if our words don't matter; our words do matter as long as we believe. When we pray the Will of the Father as it is written in the Bible, we are giving these very same words a voice. It is this voice that activates the angels on our behalf.

The angel told Daniel, "I've come for your words to burn before God." Though Daniel prayed and fasted for 21 days, it wasn't the length of time that mattered for the angel. It was Daniel's belief that motivated the angel. The angel was held up for 20 days on his way to Daniel. The angel told him he started his journey at his first word and even though he moved towards Daniel on his first day, he fought through hell to get to him.

All of heaven is poised to act on our behalf and carry out our commands as long as it lines up with the Will and Laws of God. If we are looking at this from heaven's perspective, our ceiling would be the area over the angels' heads; not the area over ours. When we stay in our own space, our potential is very limited. When we expand into the angel's domain, the possibilities are limitless. Stop seeing yourself in a box and start praying as if you are part of the universe. This is where God designed us to operate; He gave us dominion over the works of His entire hand.

There is a conversation about you in Psalm 8 where the angels state when you were a child drinking your mother's milk, God put a power in your tongue. One that would stop anything that would oppose the Will of God. It is when we pray from heaven's perspective and authority, the glass ceiling no longer matters. The words we speak would shatter anything trying to stop them.

So picture this, you're in a room thinking you're alone praying to the Father. You start out singing your favorite worship songs and rejoicing, just loving God. Images of friends and family come across your mind, and you cry out asking heaven for things you want these people to be blessed with. Have you ever considered that right above you are thousands of angels waiting to hear your next command? Because everything you asked for, for your family, friends and coworkers were being delivered by the angels on assignment.

This picture is showing we have help from heaven. It is up to us to believe it and receive it. Jesus said, "if you believe when you pray, it will be done". The secret to prayer is believing before you pray. It is not the act of prayer that gets things done; it is our mindset when we enter prayer that makes it work. We should go into prayer with clarity of mind that when we open our mouths all heaven will move on our behalf. This is why it is very important to pray the Will of God. Like we said before from Psalm 103 how the angels hearken to the voice of God. It is when we give God's Word voice; they move on our behalf.



Often in the Bible, we hear God described as the Lord of Hosts. The Host is what the army of angels are called. Jesus said the Kingdom of God is not on the outside of us, but it is at hand. Are we ready to operate with what we have at hand knowing we have the Heavenly Host to back it?





# If You Only Knew the Power In Your Hands

There is a commercial that has a tag line that asks, "What's in your wallet". It's comical and once you hear it, it's easy to remember. It also implies that what you are qualified for is determined by what's in your wallet. When we look at this statement as a whole, many people will fall for this. Many believe it is the monetary accomplishments or accumulation of wealth determined by man that will allow them to be successful or unsuccessful. All of this is derived from a simple line "What's in your wallet".

Jesus said pretty much the same thing when He said, "The kingdom of heaven is at hand". If we leave our wallets at home, then what's in it doesn't matter but your hand will go wherever you go. Try this, stretch out your hand in front of you as far as you can. This is the furthest away the kingdom of heaven will ever be from you.

I often believed that heaven or the kingdom of heaven was a mystical place in a realm far far away. But when we look at what Jesus said, He was reminding us that the Kingdom is within us. This is how the statement "Whatever you put your hands to will prosper" is played out. It doesn't prosper just because we put our hands to it; it prospers because we are the Kingdom and when we put our hands to something, the Kingdom of heaven is also touching it. God placed us on this earth to have dominion over it. He also made us ambassadors or representatives of heaven. When an American Ambassador sets up a residence in a foreign country, all the land or property he possessed in that country becomes American domain. This is the same for us. When we give our lives to God, we are no longer citizens of the world but *ambassadors of heaven*.

So, what is in the hand? In our drawings, you will notice that many of them include a cube. For us, this cube represents the Christ or the anointing of God. When we look at this picture and look closely at what is in the hand, there is a cube, and this is where the ray of energy or power is emanating from. Paul said that there was a mystery and a secret, which is the Christ in you, the hope of glory. Jesus came so that we may operate in the full power of the Christ. This is why He said we would do greater works than Him only because we will have a ministry longer than three years and the ability to use the Christ on many more people.

When you look at the picture, the anointing is in the hand. He is holding it over the instruction book, which is the Bible. The Christ in us is real, and I believe it is the single most important gift given from God. God always wanted us to be able to operate fully in His anointing. This is why He promised He would make us in His image and in His likeness. Wow! This is the first promise God made to humanity. It is when we operate in full confidence in the Christ that is in us that we are operating in God's image and likeness. There is an anointing or a power that has been granted to us from God that is within all of us; we need to tap into it.

The Bible gives us many attributes we should have when tapping into this power. It speaks about us being bold as lions and not running away. It talks about us mounting up on eagles' wings and soaring above everything. It encourages us to be diligent and in constant pursuit of God's righteousness. All of this can be equated to the mind of Christ. There is a confidence we must have to operate this Kingdom Power. We must have a clear understanding that with God on our side, what can stand against us. This is how we start to tap into the Kingdom that is at hand and use the Christ in us.

If we need specifics, we can simply use the Fruits of the Spirit as a guide to help us increase our confidence in God. Remember gifts are given, but fruit is grown. By operating in joy, peace, patience, kindness, longsuffering, love, goodness, faithfulness, self-control, gentleness, we sharpen our ability to operate like God.

Okay, how does this work? It's simple. Whenever you find yourself in a situation that you deem a problem or a test, don't complain. Simply ask the Holy Spirit which fruit is in practice in this situation. You may be faced with an issue where the only thing that will get you through this is patience. Remember, heaven has a plan. You also may be facing what you call a problem when the holy spirit just wants you to practice joy through the issue. God's ways are wrapped up in these fruits and the more we practice this, the more we will be honoring His first promise to make us in His image and His likeness.

By tapping into this anointing, we can live free and operate from a Kingdom perspective. God always wants us to live a stress-free life without any strain or struggle. Just because there is an issue or what we call a problem in front of us does not mean we are to lay down our joy or walk away from our patience and lose our self-control.



You can know something and not believe it. Now that we believe all this power resides in our hands, how could we go back and believe that we are not made on purpose? I believe God would not have given us this ability and anointed us with His Holy Spirit for no reason. There is a reason for all of this; not to walk in our old way of thinking but to act as if we are brand new. So, what will the "New You" do with all that you believe?





#### **Made Brand New**

Paul's second letter to the church at Corinth talks about being made new. He said when a person comes to Christ, old things pass away and old things are being made new. This has been a burning point in the hearts of my Wife and I.

God has been working with us from the perspective of the old man and the new creature. You see, before giving your life to God, we live a lifetime learning how to operate from our soul only, which is our emotions and our senses. We learn how to be reactive in every situation in life, either from a sensory perspective or from an emotional one. This type of life is referred to as the "old man" and is usually not from a Kingdom viewpoint. When we give our lives to God and make Him Lord of our lives, He helps us change our focus from this fleshly soulish perspective to being led by our Spirits.

In the book of Jeremiah, God tells him, "I knew you before you were formed in your Mother's womb". In this statement, God is referring to the spirit of Jeremiah that was with him before it entered the body. Our spirits yearn to be with God, and it's always in a posture, ready to worship. However, our bodies seem to have an opposite response to the things of God. This is where we get the phrase, "The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak". The interesting thing about this is that these two entities already know their end. The spirit of a man will return to heaven; this is what the phrase means "To be absent from the body is to be present with God". We often hear this when Christians pass away. At the same time, we also hear "Ashes to ashes and dust to dust" referring to the body returning to the dirt.

The only issue becomes what do we do with the soul? The battle between good and evil is over the soul. The soul is the by-product of the union of a spirit and a body, when God breathed into the nostrils of man, man became a living soul. The soul is very easily influenced, and the concern is which one will it follow? The convincing of the spirit to keep its mind on the things above, or the influence of the body to remain in carnality.

In this picture, we see what seems to be a type of surgical procedure, not to remove anything, but it seems as if something is being added. We've said before in our series of notes that the cube represents the anointing, the glory, or the Christ.

In this picture, we see the soul being removed from the body and Christ inserted. I know this may seem a little over dramatic, but Paul said that he had a mystery that was held up from the ages which was Christ in you the hope of glory.

I believe it is when we tap into this power of the Christ that indwells within us; we can do all things. What if you went throughout your day knowing you had a spot in you that was filled with all that heaven has and you were able to access it at any given moment? Jesus instructed his disciples, if you believe before you pray and not doubt, you would be able to speak to a mountain and it would obey you. He was saying without doubt that you're able to tap into that power. That is your God-given right to use, but you must operate it without having any doubt.

Everyone has the Christ in them; God is not a respecter of person. This means, God has not given anyone any ability or anointing over the next person. We all have the same access to God and the same control over the Christ that is in us. It is when we submit our lives unto God that our authorization to use the Christ in us becomes activated. The drug dealer on the corner is just as anointed as the Bishop in the pulpit. God wishes that none would parish but that all of us would one day repent and come back to Him. Our repentance or turning around and accepting Him as Lord will restore us to our rightful place as rulers over this world from a heavenly position.

When we give our lives to God, old things pass away. We are no longer being led by our flesh and are able to tap into the Christ that is in us. But all things are made new, and the newness is our ability to operate the Christ from a heavenly perspective. We are able to lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover. We are able to speak into the atmosphere and change situations. There is a boldness and assurance that we must operate from, not a down and out mentality but one that assures us we are more than conquerors.

The Christ in you is not a magic wand, and you don't just wave it at anything, but it's more like a badge that when you show it, it gives you an authority to tell the heavenly host what you need. It is your authority to speak a thing and their ability to retrieve from heaven that gets things done. There are angels waiting for us to command things and if we don't, from this place of authority, they stand around waiting. What will you use your Christ on today? Will you speak healing for a friend or provisions for a loved one or will you remain silent and let the Host stand around?

God, we ask in the name of Jesus Christ that those who read this get a revelation and clarity of the Christ in them, that they no longer wait for things to happen, but command change in Jesus name.

#### Made Brand New by Hearing His Voice



When we say being made brand new by hearing His voice, we're saying just that. When you start to hear the voice of God, you start to have a confidence that you've never had before. You start to see things happen, not only to yourself, but to your atmosphere or surroundings. You will see your prayers come true as you walk with God. Knowing heaven is on your side; nothing can stop you. This new boldness from hearing and acting out His voice will make you live like you are brand new.





## Hearing His Voice

I often questioned what it means to hear the voice of God. When I hear a person make the statement "God told me" or "I heard God say", I would feel like I was doing something wrong in my walk with God. It wasn't as if the person was trying to belittle me, I would say to myself "they hear God, so why don't I?" Most of the time, we hear God internally as a still small voice.

So, what does God sound like? If I were to ask you to count to ten out loud, no really, count to ten... That is what God sounds like 75% of the time. Now count to ten to yourself and not out loud. That is what God sounds like 95% of the time. Often, God will speak within us. If we are not careful to be sensitive to what He sounds like, we will dismiss it as our own thoughts. One of the ways we can tell it is God speaking is because it will often sound undoable.

But it wasn't until I read Psalm 103:20 that speaks about the angels who are strong, running to perform God's Word that I realized the written Word of God is the voice of God. You may be asking yourself "How could I not realize something as basic as that", but sometimes, revelation is in the simple things. Yes, the written Word or the Bible is the Logos and, the auditable voice of God is the Rhema. It is when we give the Logos our voice; the angels will also move to perform it. If I were to place a Bible on my kitchen table, it would just be a book on the table. But when I vocalize what is written within, the Power of His Word comes alive.

When someone says, "God said" or "God told me", oftentimes, it was only a thought that came into their mind through Holy Spirit. Have you ever noticed a pen on the table as you were leaving the house, and then someone asks if you have a pen? For a split second, your mind reverts back to the pen on the table. Holy Spirit is here to teach us and the first lesson He needs us to learn is how to hear Him and how to follow His instructions. The lesson was to grab that pen for the person you would meet later. We must live a life believing He knows what's coming and He will prepare us for it.

This is a lesson I hope we can rehearse as we look at this picture. We see two sets of angels. One set is in the room, and the other set is in a higher place. Both groups are watching the young man study. They are teaching him to give voice to God's Word, which will not return to Him void.

I believe if we rehearse the promises of God in the Logos, and speak them aloud, all of heaven will move on our behalf. The Lord's Prayer makes a statement about being on earth as it is in heaven. The group of angels in the room are teaching the young man to speak aloud with faith. The group outside the room is in a more heavenly place and is in position to bring heaven to earth.

We didn't answer the question, "What does God sound like"? I believe it's not a matter of pitch or tone, but phraseology. When we say God said something, it should echo the Bible. If you have a thought of being an overcomer, God is speaking to you. If a thought tells you to speak to the storm, that is the voice of God speaking to you. In God, all His promises are yes and amen. These thoughts keep us encouraged and are a constant reminder, He is never leaving or forsaken us. Jesus said I will send one who will answer all things. In John 16, Jesus said there is so much He wishes He could tell us. We were not ready to understand all He was because His mission had a timetable in it. He told the disciples when He leaves, He would send back Holy Spirit who will guide us in all truths and show us things to come. Hearing God is hearing Holy Spirit, and He will often sound like a thought. I'm not saying that the 5% of hearing God aloud will never happen; it's just that we often miss what God is saying in the 95% while searching for the five.

This picture is a simple reminder God has set up so many things to keep us on course. Jesus was put in place to teach us how to live our lives with the Christ in us and how to live with an expectation of glory. Then before He left, he said he would send Holy Spirit back and He would guide us in all truths. These truths are how we are to live with the Christ in Us.

What if we would live our life believing there are teams of heavenly agents in position to help us succeed and be victorious in everything we do? Would you live your life more fearless without anxiety and fear? Would you be bolder in your approach to your pursuits? Would you live a life never taking "No" for an answer? Knowing as long as it lines up with God's Will, the answer is Yes and Amen. The more we study and become confident in God's written Word; we will hear Him and learn to operate the Christ within.

Father God, in the name of Jesus, I ask you to touch everyone who is reading this. That you would open their eyes and understanding and show them You are with them. Let them hear you clearly and show them You love to speak to us. I ask this in Jesus name.

I decree a blessing upon them right now in the name of Jesus. I decree they will walk away with a clear understanding of You. I pray they will walk away with a sense of empowerment knowing their place in the Kingdom and knowing they are Your child. I pray they will understand that the power of heaven flows through them. Jesus said that greater we shall do. Father God, I ask that You bless these people and anoint them with Your Will. Anoint them with Your word and Your boldness.
