Los Angeles Division – 79% of last year's members have renewed (82 have not yet renewed) Since last month's report, we had 5 members renew.


San Diego Division – 76% of last year's members have renewed (29 have not yet renewed) Since last month's report, we had 3 members renew.

THE YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM (YLP)





CELEBRATING 20 YEARS

It was twenty years ago, in 1998, when the Youth Leadership program began, it was a different Century. Since then, a very select group of youngsters ranging from 14 to 16 years, have had the opportunity to attend this very prestigious program. So what is YLP? YLP is a taste of the National Academy and takes place at Quantico, VA. Every graduate of the National Academy knows the pride, comradery, knowledge and experience that is gleaned by attending, so how wonderful to sponsor a child and have them experience that same excitement and feeling of accomplishment.

Each year sixty (60) students are selected from a rigorous, competitive application process to attend the Program. Last year 60 students came from across the United States, representing 42 States, Germany, Puerto Rico and Peru. The students will got to be a part of a week-long intensive leadership program, focusing on core subjects, such as; ethics, leadership, values and choices, goal setting, bullying, accountability, social media and financial responsibility. Who wouldn't want our children and grandchildren to be taught all that at a young age?

In addition to classes, the students get to visit museums and monuments in our Nation's Capitol, including the National law enforcement officers memorial, the Holocaust museum and Arlington National Cemetery. All in all, the students complete 42 training hours and 10 physical training hours (I did say it was a taste of the National Academy!)

Since 1998, a total of 912 students have graduated from YLP and these students are really the cream of the crop, so if you have or know of a student who you believe is exceptional, because these students really are, please encourage and sponsor them to apply for the greatest program they are ever likely to experience.

The California Chapter is proud to announce the college scholarship program for the **children** and **grandchildren** of **associates**. The names of the scholarship recipients will be announced at the State Conference in Lake Tahoe on September 12, 2018.

The Guidelines for Scholarship Awards:

Applicants must be a child, step-child, adopted child or grandchild of an active Association member in good standing, or a deceased member of the Association.

Scholarships shall be awarded to applicants who are enrolled as a student in any accredited college, university, or academy approved by the Scholarship Committee. Accreditation may be verified through the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Postsecondary Education.


Awards are limited to one scholarship each calendar year during which the scholarship was awarded. Priority is given to those students who have demonstrated academic achievement by completing at least 30 semester units—or 45 quarterly units— while maintaining a minimum course load of 12 semester units—or 18 quarterly units—and an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher

The Sacramento Division held a very interesting luncheon in March. One to wet the appetites of all those who enjoy listening to a complicated and challenging case come to completion in a successful prosecution.

The Sacramento Division's luncheon was held at Red Hawk Casino in Placerville on 27 Mar 2018. The meeting was hosted by Supervising Investigator Shawn Eastman, NA 245th of the El Dorado District Attorney's Office and coordinated by California Chapter 1st Vice President Daman Christensen, NA 242nd. Investigators from the Placer County District Attorney's Office provided an in-depth debriefing on the investigation and prosecution of Mario Garcia in the 2005 homicide of Christie Wilson at the Thunder Valley Casino in Lincoln, CA.

The case was extremely difficult to prosecute because the victim's body was never located. Through DNA evidence and other innovative investigative techniques, Garcia was convicted and sentenced to 59 years to life in prison.

After the suspect fled on foot entering an apartment, officers attempted to make contact with the suspect as he fired through the door striking officers. New Pomona Police Chief Michael Olivieri (NA #267) bravely led his department through this tragic event. Our thoughts and prayers are with Chief Olivieri, the family of Officer Casillas, and everyone at the Pomona Police Department.
