

ACTOR GARY SINISE INVITES 80TH SESSION NA GRAD TO WWII MUSEUM

Those of you who read the National Magazine may remember an article I wrote a couple of years ago about **Bert Seymour**, who I believe is our oldest CONTINUING member at 94 years old. Bert graduated from the **80th Session** in 1967and has been a member ever since.

Bert retired as a Chief Deputy from the Ventura County Sheriff's Department and was one of the first Deputy Sheriffs' hired after World War II. If you were fortunate to have been at the Sacramento Christmas luncheon in 2016, you will have heard Bert speak. He is an extremely knowledgeable man with some great stories. His wife Nancy has been very active in his career and some of their earlier stories of police procedures are hilarious.

Bert, his wife Nancy and daughter Jean accompanied Bert in March of this year (2018) to the WWII museum in New Orleans, LA. Thanks to the Gary Sinese Foundation, who arranged and paid for Bert to attend the museum in order to get Bert's oral history of his time during the war. Bert maybe 94 yrs old, but his memory is still sharp and his attention to detail, impeccable!

Bert enlisted in the Army Air Corps and was sent to San Bernadino, Gulfport, MI, before being deployed overseas. First to Scotland then to Snetterton Heath, Norwich, England. Although WWII was fought on two fronts, the Pacific and Europe, Bert's focus was Europe. Bert talked at length about the B-17s, known as the workhorse of WWII, (apparently there are many hanging in the museum). During the war, the Germans would shoot down the planes, take and repair the working ones, then infiltrate the allied formations to shoot down more planes. A system was devised to prevent this by putting alphabetical markings in a shape on the tail, this code, unknown to the Germans, would allow the allies to immediately recognize an enemy. In addition, the fuselage of the planes were also painted white using 400lbs of paint. This practice was later stopped in order to save money.

During the war many of the beautiful stained glass windows were blown out due to the bombing, so the gift of a stained glass window for the church where the U.S. Choir sang was a very thoughtful and appropriate gift.

I asked Bert what his first impression of England was and he replied, "COLD! ... I was from Southern California, so I had never experienced anything like that...We wore our overcoats in the pub and locals would say, 'Drink up Yank, your beer is getting cold.'" Bert also revealed, "The base laundry was so bad it was wrecking our clothes, so local women, to make money, took over doing our laundry, they even ironed my shorts!" Bert explained that the women that took in laundry would get their young sons to bicycle over to pick up and drop off the laundry. Many years later, Bert and his family returned to England and by chance met up with the man who had bicycled over as a young lad to pick up his laundry. The 45th Combat Bombardment wing of the 3rd Bomber Division was assigned to Snetterton Heath Air Base (now a race track). The 96th Bombardment Group, of which Bert was a member, arrived December 14th, 1943 (no wonder Bert found it cold!) and were assigned to the 45th. During this time the Base Choir, consisting of Airmen, would go around to different churches and venues and sing. At the end of the war, as a gesture of goodwill, the 96th Bombardment Group, which had suffered many casualties in the war, had a collection and bought a stained glass window for St. Andrew's church in nearby Quidenham. (This commemorative window to the US Airmen is in the Lady Chapel and is mentioned on the church website at www.Quidenhamgroup.co.uk.) **All photos are from Bert's personal collection.**

All of Bert's memories and experiences have been recorded at the museum so that part of history will never fade. Bert told me he was treated like Royalty throughout the whole museum experience. *"The museum is huge, the exhibits are fantastic, but what meant the most was the amount of people thanking me, It was a huge boost and really made me feel appreciated."*

Thank you Bert for your service to your country, the City and County of Ventura, the IPA and the FBINAA.

The Sacramento Division's luncheon was held on Wednesday, August 8th at **Foster Farms** in Livingston, CA. The event was well attended and a wonderful lunch was had by all, consisting of yes, chicken!! If the lunch was any fresher it would have been clucking!

The luncheon was hosted by Livingston Police Chief, Reuben Chavez, NA #232. Attendees got to listen to DOJ Special Agent Supervisor, Dean Johnston, who gave an overview of the notorious street gang Mara Salvatrucha or MS-13, which has wreaked havoc across the United States and is now staking a claim here in California, specifically in the San Joaquin Valley. This included a debrief of some of the violent acts that have been committed in the region and the covert operations that are taking place.

This was followed by a more indepth look at the gang by three detectives who are temporarily in California from El Salvador.

In 2005, National Geographic did a documentary titled, "World's Most Dangerous Gang", portraying MS-13.

California has once again experienced devastation due to massive fires. The "Carr" fire in Shasta County being one of the worst, where among the deaths were two firefighters. About 38,000 people have been evacuated since the fire began. Four evacuation centers, churches, schools and homes were opened up for those being evacuated. Over 90,000 acres have been burnt and over 500 structures have been destroyed, one of those being the home of a Chief who is a NA graduate.

In view of this catastrophe and the NA grads who have been assisted by the National Foundation, 1st V.P. Christensen held a collection during his training luncheon. All those members in attendance were very generous in buying raffle tickets and \$630.00 was donated and sent to the Foundation.

The speaker was Padres Director of Baseball Information Services Matthew Klotsche, who has worked with GM AJ Preller in the past at other organizations. Matt spoke about the processes involved in scouting both free agents and rookies/draft picks and the challenges the team makes when looking at skillsets, and traits beyond baseball acumen, such as what sort of team representative will the potential player make and how will they affect team cohesion.





Attendees included members from both the San Diego and the LA Division and a catered lunch by Petco's catering service was enjoyed by all 50 attendees. Of special note was the longest tenured NA grad in attendance, Retired San Diego County DA Investigator Johnny Boulden of FBINA Session #137, graduating in June 0f 1984.

San Diego now has a new NAC, Erika Foxworth, we look forward to working together.

The U.S. Department of Transportation's "Unmanned Aircraft Systems Integration Pilot Program" (IPP) is an opportunity for state, local and tribal governments to partner with private sector innovators, operators and manufacturers to accelerate the development of drone technology. The Chula Vista Police (CVPD), led by one of our own Chapter members, has collaborated with the City of San Diego's Homeland Security Department to apply for the IPP and was one of only 10 agencies nationwide chosen to participate. CVPD has a three-member Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Team with four UASs that they train and deploy on a limited basis. Due to the current limitations to UAS use, i.e. FAA certification of pilots, limits to where UAS's can fly (over people), and airspace deconfliction, CVPD has sought innovative and technologically advanced solutions to these issues. CVPD developed relationships in the private sector who have the ability to provide geofenced UAS's that can be controlled by simple keyboard commands to provide real-time video streaming to responding police and fire personnel for increased safety and situational awareness. The IPP will be an opportunity to demonstrate the ability to safely implement this technology into the National Air Space and public safety agencies daily operations.
