Use the included vocabulary cards to set up a station where young learners can play an old fashion game of Memory while they build their schema and vocabulary skills! Once copied front to back, the set of cards with Jake and Gracie's picture on the front will be one stack of vocabulary terms. Spread them out in an array on the left side of a table, mat, or floor space. The second stack of cards with the characters' names will have definitions once copied front to back and can be spread out in an array on the right side of the table, floor, or mat. Once set up...let the games and learning begin!
