VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The National World War I Museum and Memorial is hosting the American Veterans Traveling Tribute (AVTT) Vietnam Wall for a twelve-day period ending on Memorial Day (May 19 – 30, 2022). The Vietnam Memorial Wall in Washington D.C. contains the names of those who gave their lives as a result of their service in Vietnam. The AVTT Wall is an 80% scale version of the Vietnam Memorial Wall. Across its 360 ft. length, the wall contains every name etched on the original memorial. Since its inception, hundreds of thousands of people across the U.S. have viewed the AVTT Vietnam Wall, and we expect thousands more to visit during the twelve days it will be on the southeast lawn of the Museum and Memorial grounds.

To accommodate visitors, we are recruiting volunteers from the community to assist those paying tribute. **Starting Thursday, May 19th at 5 p.m. through the afternoon of Monday, May 30th we are looking for over 300 volunteers.** Throughout the twelve-day period there will be 38 shifts, averaging four hours each. Our goal is to have at least eight volunteers per shift (ideally more). Attached please find more detailed information about this opportunity, including the dates/ times of each volunteer shift.
