FANBOYS: Your Coordinating Conjunctions

Master the seven powerful conjunctions that connect words, phrases, and clauses, adding flow and clarity to your writing.



F - For

Explains a reason or purpose, similar to "because."



A - And

Adds information or connects similar ideas.



N - Nor

Presents a negative alternative, often used with "neither."



B - But

Introduces a contrasting or opposing idea.



O-Or

Presents an alternative or a choice.



Y - Yet

Introduces a surprising contrast, similar to "but."



S - So


Indicates a result or consequence.

Fis for "For"

Shows reason or cause

Example: I studied hard, for I wanted to pass

Connects ideas explaining why something happens





A is for "And"

Adds Information

Combines similar ideas smoothly

Song Example

"I danced all night, and I studied hard"

Joins related elements to create flowing sentences


N is for "Nor"

Negative Alternative

Adds another negative idea

Double Negative Power

"I don't like rain, nor do I like snow"



Bisfor "But"

Shows Contrast

Highlights opposing ideas

Creates Tension

"I love to learn, but watch my knowledge grow"

The most common way to show differences between ideas





O is for "Or"



Choice A

Tea



Choice B

Coffee

Song Example: "Tea or coffee, which one will you choose?"

Presents optionsbetween two or morepossibilities

Y is for "Yet"

Expresses surprising contrast

Example: "I'm tired, yet I'll study"

Shows unexpected opposition - similar to "but" with concession



"Yet" adds an element of surprise to contrasts

Creates logical progression in sentences
