Lay Leanings

Do you love assembling things? Me? I'd rather have a root canal by a podiatrist than to sit down with the box full of 12,000 pieces, and instructions that were created by a nuclear physicist. So why, you might ask, did I purchase several pieces of furniture that needed to be assembled? I'm not sure either. Nevertheless, once I got them home and opened the boxes, I was hopelessly committed.

The first piece of furniture was exactly as I presumed it would be; something akin to water torture. I surrendered early that I didn't have the patience to read the instructions, and the result was predictable; it took significantly longer to assemble, and my nerves were frazzled to their very end.

A disproportionate amount of my life has been spent in trying to find ways to circumvent challenges or doing the work required to do something right. I suspect I'm not alone in that. But ultimately, any attempt I've ever made at trying to avoid confronting a challenge head-on, results in something far less than I had hoped for or imagined.

Before graduate school in Canada, I read a significant amount of work from a well-known international theologian. Ultimately though, nothing could compare to the 45-minute private conversation I had with him uninterrupted, where he challenged and stretched my notion of God. In truth, anything of value in my life has come about because I took the time to invest in it firsthand, rather than to find an alternative that somehow required less of me.


It occurs to me that our relationship with God cannot flourish unless we go *through* it, not around it somehow. We can know *about* God, or we can truly *know* God in a way that makes God intensely personal to us. There are no shortcuts to that kind of a relationship with God.

Over eight decades ago, the German theologian, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, coined the term, 'cheap grace' to describe the kind of comfortable, painfree faith that would prefer to go <u>around</u> the cross rather than to go through it. And yet, the truth of the cross requires that we embrace and grow from the challenges of life rather than trying to retreat from them.

There are no cliff-notes to our story of faith. Let's pray about that.

What is the Immaculate Conception by Scott P. Richart

Few doctrines of the Catholic Church are as misunderstood as the dogma of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which Catholics celebrate every year on December 8. Many people think that the Immaculate Conception refers to the conception of Christ through the action of the Holy Spirit in the womb of the

Blessed Virgin Mary. That event, though, is celebrated at the feast of the Annunciation of the Lord (March 25, nine months before Christmas). What is the Immaculate Conception?

Conceived Without Sin

The Immaculate Conception refers to the condition that the Blessed Virgin Mary was free from Original Sin from the very moment of her conception in the womb of her mother, Saint Anne. We celebrate the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary—her birth—on September 8; nine months before that is December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.
