John 1:29–42 is a conversation between Jesus and John the Baptist, and records the moment when Jesus recruits His first two disciples. Jesus is identified as “The Lamb of God,” and “The Son of God.” The Baptist describes his vision of the Holy Spirit, in the form of a dove, landing on Jesus. This confirms that He is the Messiah. The Baptist tells two of his followers, John and Andrew, to go and follow Jesus. They, in turn, introduce Jesus to Peter.

Fun Facts-Andrew and Simon

Andrew's response to just about everything is "bring it to Jesus." He has already told his brother Simon that the man he's bet is the "Messiah," meaning "The Anointed One." The Greek term is Christos, which eventually became the English word "Christ." This is the fifth of John's seven names of Jesus in Chapter 1. Jesus immediately tells Simon that he will have a new name: "Cephas." This actually an Aramaic word meaning "stone." In the original Greek, John translates Cephas as Petros, from which we get the English name "Peter." Peter's friends probably thought it was strange that someone know to be emotional and unstable was now going by the name "Rock," but he would eventually earn that title. Long before he'd done anything worth noticing, Jesus could already see his potential, and gave him a name worthy of his future. The Hebrew term bar literally means, "son of," so Simon Barjonah is literally "Simon Son of Jonah (or son of John)."
