
PRAYER TO SAINT MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL




<u>Altar Flowers</u>

Lay Leanings

Many of our parents and grandparents were formed during the Great Depression, and often they would be very frugal with money, or take precautions never to run out of basic necessities. My dad, for example, never let the gas tank in his car go below half full, and he hid money in envelopes in strategic places in the house, 'just in case'.

I certainly wasn't formed by the Depression, but that didn't prevent me from becoming anxious when, for some reason, my cell phone suddenly stopped taking a charge. With a busy day not even half over, by the time I noticed, I had less than 50% of my battery left, with a busy afternoon and evening still ahead. It didn't help that I was many miles away from home. With the little power I had left, I used the phone to locate a cell phone store. They quickly diagnosed the problem as a bad car charger, and were very eager to sell me a new one for a significant sum of money. My relief was short-lived, however, as I soon realized that the phone still wouldn't charge despite the expensive new cord. As if I weren't panicked enough, I glanced at my dash to notice that my gas gauge was nearly empty, and since I was in an unfamiliar area, I wasn't certain where to find gas. It that moment, it seemed the only thing not in short supply was my frazzledness.


The phone problems are behind me now, and when last I checked, my gas gauge was full. As I look back on the stressfulness of that day, I'm struck at how this experience of running short of things that are vital to my daily routine parallel those times when God seems absent in my life. I liken it to being in the desert without water, and panic begins to take control. What's wrong? What could this mean? What did I do wrong to alienate God? Why does God seem so distant? It seems that when I need God the most, God's gone silent.

I once shared these experiences of absence from God with a spiritual director, who in turn shared with me that God speaks loudest in the silence. Why? Because in the silence of God, I instinctively try and listen closer; something I know I don't do when I'm busy and in my routine of life.

Where once I would have panicked in the silence of God, I now acknowledge the truth ... there's no 'emptiness' of God in our lives. On the contrary, when my life becomes too 'full', I drown out the presence of God.
