

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 3:20-35

Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me.

Background on the Gospel Reading

In the section of the Gospel just before these verses, Jesus calls his Twelve Apostles. Now he performs his first exorcism. It is told within the context of conflict with his family. A crowd so large has gathered that Jesus and his disciples are not even able to eat their bread. His family comes to take him away because they think he is beside himself. And the scribes think he is possessed by the devil. Jesus points out to them the absurdity of their thinking that he uses the devil to cast out demons. In fact, it is Jesus who ties up the strong June 15: Children's Boat Building Workshop

He concludes with a brief saying about the forgiveness of sins. All sin can be forgiven except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It's not known exactly what he means by this. It could be that the only sin that can't be forgiven is the one that cuts you off from the source of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit.

Mark then brings Jesus' family back into the picture. They are not presented in a critical light but are just trying to see him. This gives Jesus the opportunity to point out that family for him is not based on blood.

Lay Leanings By Deacon Mike Stewart

Okay, I'm going to offer you a full sensory experience, are you ready? We're going to sing, and we're going to poke our imaginations in creative ways. Ready?

Our 3-year-old granddaughter, Gracie, is a walking, breathing sensory experience. Imagine a little girl with Shirley Temple ringlets, who, all throughout Mass on Sunday, is singing (usually not the song we're singing, but it works), and 'amen'ing', and 'alleluia'ing' her way through it all with an unrivaled spirit.

Recently, when we gathered for my brother's funeral, since our family is of Scottish origin, we included a bagpiper to begin the service. At the very sound of that unfamiliar instrument, Gracie wheeled around and was, at first, terrified, but that quickly evolved into complete fascination. The familiar sound of Amazing Grace was rich and unmistakable. Though there were no words sung, those words were nonetheless on all our hearts, and clearly on Gracie's heart as well. What has followed in these weeks for that little one has been a steady diet of YouTube videos of bagpipers playing Amazing Grace. But somewhere along the way, she began to put words to that song. Okay, here's the sensory part. Close your eyes and imagine that familiar hymn, and a little girl belting out at the top of her lungs, "O keeps, my Lord, O keeps my Lord, O keeps my Lord, O keeeeeeeps ...," I think you get the picture.

"Whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it," the words of Jesus in the 10th chapter of Mark's Gospel.

At the risk of needing to understand what may have inspired that little girl to well up those few, but curious words, it does nonetheless challenge us to consider what inspires us 'big people' to draw more deeply into the mystery of our faith. It is certainly no surprise that Jesus drew on that powerful image of the uncluttered minds of children.

Why? Perhaps to help us move beyond needing to intellectualize our faith, to understand a God who is not to be understood, but rather to be believed and loved. For some like Gracie, the inspiration comes through music, and still others, perhaps through experiences. Whatever it is, however it comes, clearly God is encouraging us big people to move beyond the struggle that often comes from the insistence of understanding, and instead, to just freely surrender to whatever it is that brings us to that moment of mystery that is God.

By the way, Gracie finally figured out the right words to Amazing Grace; but honestly, I sort of liked her original version much better.


