





Lay Leanings

"How did it get so late so soon?" ~Dr. Seuss

I offered a greeting to a friend celebrating a milestone birthday recently. He thanked me but offered, *"Well I guess time is not my friend."* Not long after, I went to visit a man who had just entered hospice; his life was beginning to slip away from him. After we had some time to talk and pray, he said to me, *"Clearly, time is not my friend."*

I understand that it's easy to feel that way sometimes, when there never seems to be enough time to accomplish all that is set before us in the course of a day. Yet let's be honest, if God suddenly gave us 12 more hours in a day, we'd likely find ourselves just as squeezed by 36 hours as we are with 24. And by the way, believers are no less challenged to manage the time they've been given than non-believers.

As I've grown older, I've found myself praying more about the challenge of time. What's occurred to me is that time itself isn't bad or good, friendly or unfriendly; rather, time just ... is. Clearly, only the Author of all time writes the minutes of our lives on our hearts. That's not for us to know or give. As Jesus himself reminded us, *'But of that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone.'* Mt 24:36

So if time isn't ours to give, why then don't we better honor the time we have been given? Why do we so often say that God and family are the most important priorities in our lives, and yet our calendars reflect something very different? Consider a little examination of conscience by looking back over the last month, in which God gifted us with a whopping 744 hours .. hours that we'll never get back. How did I choose to use those hours? How much time did my family receive? How much time was spent lending a hand to those who are less fortunate? How much time was spent focused on the people God entrusted to me to love and serve? Or, how much time did I spend working or building my career? How much of my time was left-over to offer to the God who created me and all things?

I've decided that I don't make friends with time, I make friends with people, and so, like you, I'm challenged to give my time to the people God placed in my life.

Teach us to count our days aright,

that we may gain wisdom of heart. Ps 90:12


