33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time **Gospel Reading**

Luke 21:5-19

Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem and warns his followers that persecution will come before the end time.

Background on the Gospel Reading

In the context of Luke, today's Gospel appears near the end of Jesus' teaching in Jerusalem, just prior to the events that will lead to his crucifixion. His warnings and predictions are ominous but can be read in many ways.

To those who first heard Luke's Gospel, those may have been words of encouragement. The destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem by the Romans was history (70 A.D.); Luke's Gospel, Catholic scholars propose, was written between 80 and 90 A.D. His audience was probably Gentile Christians. Luke here tries to interpret the fall of Jerusalem for them and to locate it in God's plans for humankind (salvation history). At the same time, Luke is suggesting to his audience that there will be a considerable elapse of time before Jesus' final coming. Luke's listeners have likely seen much upheaval and are anxious to know if these are the signs of Jesus' coming. Luke is urging greater patience.

In the second part of today's Gospel, Jesus warns that his followers will face persecution for their beliefs. Luke presents persecution as an opportunity for the followers of Jesus for "It will lead to your giving testimony" (Luke 21:13). In persecution God's wisdom and power will be shown in the example of followers of Jesus. Perseverance in the face of persecution will lead to their salvation.

Here Jesus is assuring his followers that God is present to all believers, even in times of trouble. Ultimately, Jesus will witness to this with his own death. As disciples of Jesus, we try to follow his example, trusting in God's mercy and protection, even when we are facing difficulties.

I was in a group of people when I glanced down at my phone for just a split second to see an email from the Michigan Lottery. I had honestly forgotten that the *Mega Millions* jackpot was a cool \$1.9 billion, but even more so, I forgot that I had purchased a couple tickets online just a day or so earlier. Nevertheless, the 'subject' line sharpened my memory like a razor; 'Your winnings have arrived.' For real .. this is how they notify you that you are a billionaire? Really? This is probably one of those hacker emails; click on the link and you immediately download a nasty virus. But hey, with \$1.9 billion, I'll just buy another laptop, right? Maybe I'll even buy the whole company!

I opened the email to receive the good news that my winnings amounted to ... \$12.00. Not only wasn't I a billionaire, but in that very instant, it occurred to me that I had actually lost several dollars. Try to imagine air rushing out of a balloon.

So, if suddenly your life was transformed into something that was previously beyond your imagination, what would change for you? How would you live? Would your priorities change? Would you maintain the same relationships? Would you come-and-go as you had before?

Our faith would challenge us to consider that what happens to us, even if through random fortune or misfortune, only potentially changes what we 'do,' but it doesn't change who we are. There's a tendency to equate our occupation, our income, the circumstances of life, with who we are, and yet that couldn't be further from the truth. 'Who' you are on the inside (your spirit) is how God knows you, since oftentimes we keep this aspect of ourselves carefully hidden from others. Who we are, represents the core of our being, who God made us to be. While it has the potential to keep us grounded, we are also citizens of a world swirling around us; and oftentimes we get caught up in that swirl and stray from who God made us to be. But at that core, we also know that although we can hide our hidden self from others, we can't hide it from God.

In the Letter to the Hebrews (13:8), we're assured that, although we are influenced and led by the world around us, Jesus <u>never</u> changes. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Hebrews 13:8


