BOOK REVIEWS BY FOTL MEMBERS

A THOUSAND STEPS by T. Jefferson Parker

If you're looking for a riveting read, consider T. Jefferson Parker's latest thriller, *A Thousand Steps*. Set in Laguna Beach in 1968 during the post-Summer of Love period, Parker's latest is a page-turner of a book. The story is told from the perspective of a 16-year-old boy who resides in the beach town. His ex-cop father left him, his mother is addicted to opium-laced hash, and his brother is a solider in Vietnam. But his biggest concern is his missing sister who vanishes suddenly. He works with the police to find her, and in the process is forced to make some difficult decisions.

In addition to being a probing mystery, this novel is a compelling coming-of-age story with a '60s beachside vibe. Parker, who is FOTL's featured speaker on June 18, lived in Laguna Beach as a teen in 1968, so he accurately and masterfully transports readers to this tumultuous time.


