MaryEllen was a coal miner's daughter before Loretta Lynn made it popular. She was born in a small coal mining town in Pennsylvania. It was the 1950s and the coal was running out. The family decided to venture to the land of opportunity, Fullerton, California.

After spending her early years in north Orange County, MaryEllen lived in the Sacramento area for 10 years. Preferring a moderate climate. climate, she returned to Southern California where she found employment with a small technology company, which was acquired by IBM eight years later. Her time in the technology industry allowed MaryEllen to travel the world managing sales training programs. MaryEllen feels fortunate to have traveled to Europe, Asia and everywhere in between. Her passport has more stamps than James Bond. After 20 years, MaryEllen retired in 2016.

After retirement MaryEllen attended her first author luncheon on the invitation of a friend. She was so impressed with the Library and its program, she knew she wanted to volunteer for the Friends of the Library. Initially she asked if she could help with room and table organization but the FOTL board had bigger and better plans for her. Since then, she has been on the election committee, served as the Board recording secretary and just completed her term as Vice President, Programs.

MaryEllen handled the author visits, which included luncheons, teas, and just plain sit-downs. During the pandemic when the library was closed, she hosted Zoom author interviews. The author talks reached more than 1300 people during this period.

MaryEllen can't seem to find enough to keep her busy. She also volunteers at the Huntington Beach Senior Center, working at Huntington Beach Council on Aging social events and as a travel host on the many day trips offered. As if that was not enough, she decided to try her hand at golf during the pandemic. After joining a national women's golf organization and playing a few rounds, MaryEllen thought she might enjoy golf a little more if she took lessons. Even after taking a few lessons, she has accepted she will never become a great golfer, but enjoys the game and her time on the golf course with friends.

However, the highlight of MaryEllen's life is her family who live nearby in Huntington Beach as well. Her son and his wife are parents to her three beautiful granddaughters whom she loves sharing travel and new experiences as much as possible.


BOOK CLUBS



ETERNAL

I really like this book.

Lisa Scottoline, known for legal drama and courtroom thrillers, has created an historical fiction work set in an unusual time and place and entitled Eternal.

Italy in the 1930's and 40's has been overlooked in favor of more familiar parts of Europe, but *Eternal* presents a poignant love story set among the prelude to war, the Nazi occupation and the Holocaust.

Scottoline's extensive research provides actual people and events to set the stage for her fictional characters to come alive. The author transports the reader to Rome and environs; homes, restaurants, bars, famous buildings are described in detail as vivid as a photograph.

Family relationships drive the action as the characters grow from teens to young adults and the world progresses into a World War. The Nazis occupy Italy and the tentacles of the Holocaust snatch one of the families and destroys an entire Jewish neighborhood.

This is a work that requires the reader to pause from time to time to contemplate and savor the content and the presentation. If you want a synopsis, read the book jacket. If you want an experience, immerse yourself in *Eternal*.


