### FOTL Teams Up with Fluor

James C. Harris, Fluor engineer and Huntington Beach native, has always been a huge fan of Huntington Beach Public Library. So, when he needed used books for Fluor's community service project with California-based nonprofit Think Together, he wondered if the Friends of the Huntington Beach Public Library's Used Book Store might be able to lend a helping hand.

As it turned out, the Used Book Store was able to provide a whopping 1,000 used children's books to Fluor, which were eventually donated to economically-disadvantaged, afterschool students in the Compton Unified and Lynwood Unified school districts.

Long-time Used Books volunteer Becky Roepke was thrilled by Harris' request because at that time there was a surplus of used books that needed homes. "We were happy to help them out because we had more books than we could sell," said Roepke.

After Roepke and her team sorted and packed 50+ boxes of books, Harris and Kimberly Cendana, a Fluor colleague, picked them up and transported them to Fluor. Sixty Fluor employees cleaned book covers, fixed dog eared corners, and covered notes from previous owners to make them look as new as possible. "Since they would be donated to kids who don't own many books, our intent was to make them look like brand-new books," said Harris.

Since Think Together doesn't have the staff to undertake such a large project, they were appreciative of both Fluor and FOTL for this generous donation. In addition to a book, each student received a bookmark, produced by Fluor.

"Locating this many used books would not have been possible without the Friends of the Library's help," said

Harris. "We are thankful of their partnership and look forward to working with them again."

The Friends of the Library's Used Book Store is known throughout Orange County for its wide selection of low-priced used books and its hard-working volunteers who collect, sort, price, and sell the merchandise. This collaborative effort is a win-win for the community since a wide array of bargain books and materials are available for purchase while the monies earned are donated to the library to acquire new books and fund programs for patrons.




## FLUOR PRESENTS \$500 DONATION TO FOTL





### TOM LAKE

Fans of Ann Patchett will enjoy her latest book, *Tom Lake*, which explores love, family, and the complexities of human relationships.

Set in the summer of 2020 in northern Michigan, the story unfolds amidst the backdrop of a cherry farm during the Covid pandemic. The protagonist, Lara, narrates to her three daughters during the lockdown the story of her youthful romance with a movie star named Peter Duke, offering a nostalgic and mellow tone throughout the novel.

The narrative is rich with deeply human depictions, as it juxtaposes Lara's current life on the cherry farm with her past experiences as a young actress. This duality provides a layered insight into the protagonist's life, as well as into the dynamics of parent-child relationships. The novel also touches on themes like the fleeting nature of life and love, and the importance of appreciating small, everyday moments.

This novel is perfect for readers looking for a compelling book about the mother-daughter relationship and relationships with sisters.

The audiobook version of "Tom Lake," narrated by Meryl Streep, has been praised by reviewers. Streep's narration brings a tender voice to Lara, enhancing the storytelling aspect of the novel.

"This particular customer was greatly bereaved at the news of Sandy's passing, as were we all," says Susan. "Sandy was a great lady, a great asset to the library, and a wonderful friend to us all."

Sandy is survived by her husband, Larry (they quietly celebrated 60 years of marriage in 2023), her children, Kelly Ann, Kevin Robert, and Keith Vincent; and grandchildren, Jordan Blanchard, Adam Blanchard, and Sunny Leonard Utsler. Sandy loved spending time with her family. As a devoted mother and grandmother, Larry notes that she was more of a "carrot" than "stick" disciplinarian. "She was a force to be reckoned with if her progeny were in any way being treated unfairly!"


Sandy definitely left an indelible mark on family, friends, neighbors, Friends of the Library volunteers, library patrons, and strangers.




