**School Supply List**

- Backpack: Look for a sturdy backpack with multiple compartments to keep things organized.
- Binders: Get a set of 2-inch or 3-inch binders to store subject-specific notes and worksheets.
- Loose-leaf paper: Purchase a pack of loose-leaf paper for assignments and note-taking.
- Dividers: Get a set of dividers to organize different subjects in your binders.
- Pens and pencils: Have a good supply of blue or black pens and a few pencils for writing.
- Highlighters: Get a set of different colored highlighters for marking important information.
- Erasers: Have a few good quality erasers for correcting mistakes.
- Pencil case: Get a pencil case to keep your pens, pencils, erasers, and other small supplies organized.
- Ruler: Purchase a ruler with both metric and standard measurements for math and other subjects.
- Calculator: Check with your school if a specific calculator is required. If not, a basic scientific calculator will be useful.
- Colored pencils: Get a set of colored pencils for art projects and highlighting information.
- Glue sticks: Purchase a few glue sticks for craft projects and attaching papers.
- Scissors: Have a pair of scissors for cutting paper and other materials.
- Index cards: Get a pack of index cards for making flashcards and studying.
- Sticky notes: Purchase sticky notes for marking pages and writing reminders.
- USB drive: Have a USB drive or external hard drive for backing up important files and transferring data.
- Headphones or earbuds: Get a pair of headphones or earbuds for computer-based activities and multimedia learning.
- Pocket dictionary: Consider having a pocket dictionary for looking up unfamiliar words.
- Agenda or planner: Get an agenda or planner to keep track of assignments, due dates, and extracurricular activities.
