Dear Gardeners.

Now, in the last days of summer, there are flowers galore. Dahlias are abundant and gorgeous in my garden. Many factors contributed to my garden disaster this summer, including deer, but deer are not fond of dahlias. Dahlias are heavy drinkers and thrived with all the rain! Some interesting facts about dahlias. **1. There are thousands of types of dahlias.** There are 30 species and over 20,000 cultivars of dahlias. Those cultivars are categorized based on size, flower pattern, and how they resemble other flowers. They are easy to grow but are not winter hardy in our zone and need to be dug up in the fall and stored indoors over the winter.

2. Dahlias were originally a foraged food source and classified as a vegetable. Dahlias are named after 18th-century Swedish botanist Anders Dahl. He categorized them as a vegetable because of their edible tubers. The tubers are said to taste like a mix between a potato and a radish. Before insulin, the tubers of dahlias were used to balance blood sugar due to their high fructose content.

3. Dahlias are a great cut flower with a long vase life. In the language of flowers, dahlias symbolize resilience, wildness, positivity, and growth.

4. Dahlias originated in Central America. *Dahlia pinnata* is the national flower of Mexico because the plant was first recorded in that country in 1615.

5. There are no pure black variety are no true blue dahlias.

As we approach Fall, we all appreciate the changes in structure, color and texture in the garden. Club members are invited to share the bounty from their gardens on Saturday, September 23 at Foss Field from 11 to 2.
