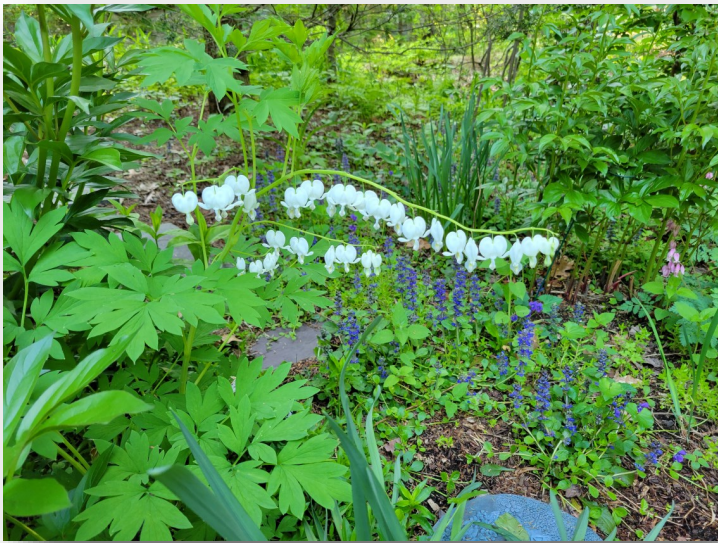
The Dockside Team will meet Friday morning at 9am to finish up and ready everything for Memorial Day Festivities. Come down to say Hi!

The Bleeding Hearts in my gardens are lovely and some are beginning to set their seeds which you can see in the pictures.

They look like tiny "green beans" . From each heart grows a seed pod which will mature in a few months and turn light tan and if you open the pod the tiny seeds will be black. Collect them and put them where you want new plants. Or let them self seed and transplant these tiny babies next spring wherever you want them. Seeds can be collected and kept for few years.
