Graduating in Spring (or Summer, not sure yet!) 2024 with a specialization in Musical Theatre and a Dance Minor

What has been your most impactful theatrical experience here at BGSU?

My most impactful theatrical experience at BGSU was playing Claire's understudy in *Ordinary Days* as a freshman. *Ordinary Days* is a four-person show with an incredibly challenging score (the show is entirely sung-through; there are no lines), and such intricate layers within each character. Claire specifically was such an

interesting yet difficult character to understand and portray. Because this show happened during Covid, we recorded the show rather than performing it live for the university, however, understudies were given a live understudy run. This meant that we had to record all of the songs in a studio, learn all of the stage blocking (and then relearn new camera blocking to record the show), and lip sync for the entirety of the live performance. I truly began to feel like an actor who was worthy of pursuing this as a career during the process of this show. It was one

My goal is to work as a professional performer in so many different capacities. Performing is my deepest passion and what I truly feel like I was meant to do in this life, as cheesy as it may sound! I want to work alongside seasoned, professional performers, learn from them and absorb all of the information they have to offer, and hopefully one day be respected and remembered for my work in the theatre industry. I want to act as a role model for younger people

who aspire to pursue the same career, and most all, I want to create art that means something to people. I want to advocate for more representation of people like me – Middle-Eastern women in the industry, as well as more representation of people of color in theatre in general. I want to work on projects that come from and speak to my soul. I want to make a difference in this world through the outlet that I most understand how to.

What advice would you give to Future Falcons and underclassmen?

Don't ever be afraid to stop and take in moments that you know you will remember in the future. Please, please, among all of the stress that comes with being college, do NOT forget to have fun. I spent way too many days worrying about what was up next, and nowhere near enough days truly allowing myself to enjoy the present. You (more than likely) will only be a college student once in your life. Focus on your schoolwork, yes, but go to events. Do shows. Party (within reason, lol). Go on late night drives with friends. Enjoy it all while it lasts, because everyone will tell you it flies by for a reason. Also — work your BUTT off, and I mean it. Nobody is going to do the work for you. There will be times that you feel so incredibly lonely. Keep working and strive to get better at your craft every single day. Take rests when you need to, but never ever stop putting in the effort to become better at your craft, because that is what you are here to do.


