What is Domestic Violence?

- Domestic Violence is a pattern of behavior which involves abuse or abusive behavior by one partner towards another within an intimate partner relationship. This tactic is used to gain and maintain control over the other partner.
- Examples of Intimate Partner relationships are: marriage, cohabitation or dating relationships.
- This abuse can also be referred to as (IPV) Intimate Partner Violence.
- It is the most under reported crime in the U.S.

Other Types of Domestic Violence Include:

- Elderly Abuse
- Child Abuse
- Abuse between any parties living together in the same household.

How Prevalent Nationally?

- About 1 in 4 women and 1 in 7 men have experienced severe violence by an intimate partner
- On average, nearly 20 people per minute are victims of physical violence by an intimate partner in the United States.
- Intimate partner violence accounts for 20% of all violent crime.

How Prevalent in Georgia?

- Georgia ranks 22nd in the nation for the rate at which women are killed by men.
- From 2011 through 2020 at least 1,516 Georgia citizens lost their lives due to domestic violence.
- ▶ 136 Georgia citizens died due to domestic violence in the year of 2020.

Quick Facts about Domestic Violence

- ▶ 47 % of female victims of intimate partner violence have at least one minor child together
- ▶ Frequent exposure to domestic violence normalizes violence for children and increases their risk of becoming domestic violence victims and/ or abusers.

Intimate partner violence is most common among women between the ages of 18-24.

Firearms

Victims are more likely to be killed by their partner who owns or has access to a firearm (70% in Georgia during 2017) than all other means combined.



Children and Domestic Violence

In 29% of the cases studied through Georgia's fatality review project, children witnessed the domestic violence killing.



Effects on Children Exposed to Violence

- Sleep Disturbances
- Feelings of helplessness and passivity
- Generalized fearfulness
- Inhibited play and exploration
- Loss of recently acquired developmental skills (e.g., walking or talking)
- Easily startled
- Scanning for danger/expecting danger
- Aggressiveness
- Over-sexualized behaviors
