Participants in the workshop assume a family identity. The task of the families is to provide for basic necessities and shelter during the course of four 15-minute weeks. Participants experience poverty compressed into the real time of the simulation. Afterwards in the debriefing, they share insights of extraordinary vividness and intensity.
