Willa Cather & the Nebraska Prairie

May 21, 2025

Spend the day discovering the life and works of Willa Cather, one of Nebraska's most famous and cherished authors. Explore the small town of Red Cloud which inspired her writings. Experience the beauty of an untamed prairie when the wild flowers are blooming in the month of May.

Suggested reading of My Antonia before the tour

Today we travel to Red Cloud, Nebraska. Willa Cather's memories of Red Cloud and its people inspired six of her twelve novels and many of her most beloved short stories. Cather spent her childhood in this small railroad town which today is the largest living memorial to an author in the country. Upon arrival, we will visit the National Willa Cather Center. The center will give us an opportunity to learn more about Cather's life and work through exhibits. The center also contains a bookstore and gift shop.

The Willa Cather Foundation has preserved many of the sites associated with Cather's literature, and we will tour four of the historic sites in downtown Red Cloud. Our first site is the childhood home of Willa Cather. This restored home contains many family artifacts including furniture, prints, and family photographs. Upstairs is young Willa's small attic bedroom. Cather wallpapered this room herself and the rose colored wallpaper is still there. The room was also the inspiration for the bedroom of fictional character, Thea Kronborg, in *The Song of the Lark*. We will also visit the 1888 Farmers and Merchants Bank and the 1885 Red Cloud Opera House where we will enjoy a box lunch.

After lunch, we will drive by the Burlington Depot and J.L. Miner House. The Miner house was described in *My Antonia* where Antonia worked. This afternoon we will leave the community of Red Cloud and journey to the wild prairie countryside that inspired her writings. A local guide will take us to the Willa Cather Memorial Prairie. The site is a botanical treasure consisting of 612 acres of never-been-plowed native prairie.
