Fall Colors in Iowa's Loess Hills

Enjoy the beautiful fall colors of the Loess Hills of western Iowa. Visit Hitchcock Nature Center, Preparation Canyon overlook, Sawmill Hollow Organic Farm, and other scenic locations

Discover the beauty and serenity of the Loess Hills of western Iowa. We begin our journey with a visit to Sawmill Hollow Organic Farm in Missouri Valley, Iowa. Set on 150 acres in the Loess Hills, the farm is America's first aronia berry farm. The berry is famous for being a natural antioxidant. From the comfort of the lodge, enjoy a tasting of foods made with the berries which include gourmet aronia salsa, aronia berry jelly, aronia berry syrup and even aronia chili starter. Sawmill Hollow also produces a variety of premium aronia berry wines.

Our next destination is and stop at the scenic overlook at Preparation Canyon State Park. The overlook deck provides a panoramic view of the Missouri River Valley for miles and miles. It is also a wonderful place for group photos or a personal photo with a friend. Lunch today will be in at the nearby Bethesda Lutheran church in the small community of Moorhead, Iowa. Enjoy a large homecooked lunch provided by the parish women. After lunch, we will travel to the



historic Ingemann Danish Lutheran Church in the countryside. Built in 1884 by a pocket of Danish immigrants, services were conducted in the native Danish language until 1918. Today the historic church with its cemetery serves as a reminder of the early settlers of western Iowa.

This afternoon we visit the Loess Hills Lavender Farm gift store. Shop for a variety of lavender made products from lavender bath bombs to insect repellent. The store also contains a variety of handmade items from over 40 vendors in the area. Enjoy a slice of Small's Fruit Farm apple pie and coffee in their adjoining banquet area. After visiting the Lavender Farm, we will travel a few miles down the road to Small's Fruit Farm. Covering five generations, the orchard has been in the same family since 1895. The farm is surrounded by apple orchards; you can purchase apples and fresh apple cider in the farm sales barn. A cooler will be available on the coach for those who would like to purchase frozen apple pies.

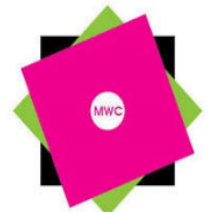
Hitchcock Nature Center in Honey Creek, Iowa, is the last stop of the tour. Learn about the fall hawk migration during a slide presentation at the center. Later spend time to enjoying the scenic fall colors from the center's large observation deck. Maybe catch a glimpse of a hawk or eagle passing through the area.


