Carole Kinlow, founder and CEO of Carole's House of Hope, was honored with the 2025 Mother of the Year Award by the American Mother's Association in May of 2025. Carole and her husband have 6 children, 20 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren.

Carole's House of Hope utilizes the Eight Dimensions of Wellness Model, that focusses on eight categories or dimensions; Social, Occupational, Spiritual, Physical, Emotional, Intellectual, Environmental and Financial. By applying the model, each participant becomes more aware of the connection between each dimension and how they contribute to healthy living. This holistic model explains: How a person contributes to their environment and community, and how to build better living spaces and social networks.

Social:

How a person contributes to their environment and community, and how to build better living spaces and social networks

Occupational:

The enrichment of life through work, and its connections to living and playing

Spiritual

The development of belief systems, values and creating a world-view

Physical:

The benefits of regular physical activity, healthy eating habits, strength and vitality as well as personal responsibility, self-care and when to seek medical attention

Emotional:

Self-esteem, self-control, and determination as a sense of direction

Intellectual:

Creative and stimulating mental activities, and sharing your gifts with others

Environmental:

Good health by occupying pleasant, stimulating environments that support well-being

Financial

Recognizing creative abilities and finding ways to expand knowledge and skills

The courses, groups and activities offered at CHH are geared toward addressing participant identified goals in each of the Eight Dimensions of Wellness. Each participant is required to complete assessments that allow the staff to determine what courses and activities would be most beneficial in helping this young lady reach her goals.

- ♦ Emails should be completely written and forwarded to the Email Communicator with instructions as to who should receive the email (all members or just Board Members and Committee Chairs) and when.
- ♦ Call or Text the Communications Specialist to confirm that the email was received.
- ♦ Types of information sent out in mass emails to members or committee chairs:
 - ⇒ Changes to announcements made in the newsletter (time and date changes or corrections)
 - ⇒ Activities not announced in the newsletter such as Cinema Chicks
 - ⇒ Reminders for fundraisers
 - ⇒ Announcements for deaths and/or funeral arrangements for current or past club members and families
 - ⇒ Emergency Announcements such as those that are weather related
