BRIDGES OUT OF POVERTY

There are more than 100,000 people living in poverty in the Omaha/Council Bluffs metro area. Omaha Bridges was created to solve this problem. Through their 10-week Getting Ahead classes they are on the way to achieving their long-term goals of reducing poverty in the metro area by 50% over the next decade. Their classes teach life skills such as problem solving, goal setting, time management, personal financial management and negotiating skills. They have a 94% graduation rate. The average graduate increases their income by about \$18,000. Families then move from instability to self-sufficiency.

CAROLE'S HOUSE OF HOPE

Provides transitional living for young women and mothers who have aged out of foster care or have become homeless. Their home-like environment, paired with innovative programs and services, encourages self-sufficiency and independence, promotes healing and ultimately restores hope. They are a trauma informed agency that provides support to those who have suffered emotional and mental health trauma due to varied and individual life experiences. Activities and outings promote a sense of community. They're Beyond the House after-care program extends support long after a participant has gained their independence.

PROJECT PINK'D

From the moment of diagnosis through end-of-life Project PINK'D provides tools, resources and a strong network to strengthen and renew the mind, body and spirit of breast cancer survivors in Nebraska and Western Iowa. They offer financial, emotional and physical support. They have a great relationship with health care providers and social workers in the area and this is where they get most of their referrals. They have a Survivor's Unite Facebook group with 1,000 members. In conjunction with Hy-Vee they have a Care to Share program which provides a luncheon and Thanksgiving meals. Their Helping Hand Program has given out \$300,000 to help patients financially. Project PINK'D gifts women with breast cancer beautiful kits worth appropriately \$100 to patients undergoing surgery, chemo and radiation. They are local - 100% of what's raised stays here. All programs are free. Primarily an all-volunteer organization. Empowers survivors to live their best life and are dedicated to helping survivors thrive.
