The following are our suggested charities for 2023-24. Charity Selection Committee submitted 6 charities to the Board for their consideration at our meeting on March 21st. The Board was requested to pick three out of the six. We are now presenting to you, MWC members, those three charities. We will be asking you to vote for one at our Style Show on April 11th. SUGGESTED CHARITIES FOR 2023-2024

(Listed Alphabetically)

BRIDGES OUT OF POVERTY

Their mission is defeating poverty-period! They believe the most empowering and effective way to do this is to not merely give people fish-they teach them to fish! Over the next decade they are committed to helping 25,000 working-age adults lift themselves out of poverty. The program is holistic and empowers the individual. Defeating poverty reduces crime, substance abuse and allows citizens to thrive. The program involves problem solving, goal setting, time management, personal financial management, negotiation/mediation, vocabulary/language and controlling emotions. They have a 94% graduation rate. The average graduate increases their net income by nearly \$1,500 per month (\$18,000/yr), with an average decrease in debt-to-income ratio of 58%. Families are then moving from instability to self-sufficiency.

UPDATE 2023: Eventually want to graduate 2,500 individuals/yr. There is a 20:1 return to the community for every \$ invested in BOP. They partner with more than 100 local organizations. New Program "Getting Ahead in the Workplace" takes lifechanging curriculum into the

workplace with coaching & Department of poverty over the next decade will have a \$1 billion annual impact on our community in terms of increased incomes and decreased government benefits & Department on the substantial "indirect benefits" (lower crime, etc.)

LEAST OF My BRETHREN

LOMB is a street ministry with it's roots in St. Patrick's Church in Gretna and it's branches reach out across the city to serve the homeless in Omaha and Council Bluffs. Firstly, they provide basic survival needs to those on the street. Secondly, their goal is to identify individuals who can sustain themselves with a source of income and help them get situated in a new apartment with all the furnishings needed. LOMB provides food, blessing bags, clothing, and sleeping bags. They hold monthly breakfasts and lunches where they provide free haircuts and bicycles (for mobility to get to work) in addition to food. Their ultimate goal is to offer a solution to homelessness and give individuals a chance to have the dignity and success that everyone deserves. 25% of their weekly move-ins provide women support to establish a new home environment enabling them to flee their pasts and get a fresh start in life. They work closely with other nonprofits including Bethlehem House and Mater Filius and the Salvation Army.

TOGETHER

Together's mission is to prevent and end hunger and homelessness in the Omaha and surrounding communities. Together envisions a community of prosperity where everyone experiences safe, affordable housing, food security, health and wellness. Their Nourish Program assists with basic needs through Choice Food Pantry and nutrition education. They support those at risk of sudden homelessness through their Crisis Engagement Program. The Horizon Program provides case management and support for those transitioning from homelessness to self-sufficiency. Together also operates a Non-Congregate Shelter which provides temporary housing in a hotel setting, primarily for seniors with medical needs as they transition to stable housing.

UPDATE 2023: In recent years Together's financial investments in services & Department of employees have nearly quadrupled, but more importantly, the number of people they have served, the unique ways they serve those in need, and their impact has grown the same. In third quarter 2022 their Rapid Re-housing Program (transitioning chronic homeless people to self-sufficient housing) had a rate of ZERO participants re-entering the homeless system. That is a 100% success rate with a national average that runs in the 78% range. Together's Crisis Engagement Team (helping those at risk of becoming homeless) has been extremely busy with roughly 3xs an increase in calls over last year.
