INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

- 1. Activities: When Omaha Schools are closed, or switch to remote learning, Metro Women's Club activities are also canceled, ie. Bunco, Bridge, MahJongg, etc.
- Luncheons: When Omaha Schools are closed or switch to remote learning, our luncheons are canceled, <u>only if they are at a Restaurant</u>. All Luncheons held at a private catered venue, such as Arbor Hall, are not canceled. If the venue is a private catered venue you will be charged for your luncheon if you are a no-show.
- 3. Board Meetings: Board Meetings are an exception to the Omaha School closing rule. Board Meetings will only be canceled if travel is not recommended by our Police Department, Mayor Office and our Roads Department. In this case the meeting will be held by our President via Zoom. If weather is a problem, Officers and Chairpersons must email their Newsletter information to Marcelene Lewis. The Newsletter must still go out no matter the weather.

Group Gets a Taste of OSS

Metro Women's Club is a group dedicated to friendship and supporting local non-profits that are bettering our community.

This year they have named Omaha Street School as their philanthropic focus, and they wanted their membership to hear from a couple of OSS students.

At an October 11th luncheon the Metro Women's Club got a taste of the impact that the Street School can make in the life of a teenager!

At the luncheon two OSS students, Mayalyn and Ajourh, both juniors, and Linda Reimer, the Executive Director of OSS, got an opportunity to share the story of the Street School.

"I felt calm, if that makes sense. The ladies weren't judging us when we were talking about our life situations, what we have going on," said Maya.

Ajourh agreed. "At first it was nerve racking to share my story. But when I started adjusting to it I was more relaxed."

Along with great food and company, the group heard about the impact of the Street School. Both students have struggled with the large size of previous schools, and that led to truancy and to behavior struggles. But at OSS, they have found a home.

"I told them that I liked the size of the school. I also told them that it is easy being at this school. Kids succeed here," Maya said. "

"It brings down my anxiety a lot," Ajourh added.
