WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH ONE OF OUR GROUPS

Imagine, our Writer's Group, met on March 21, 2024 with 7 members present. Since we began our journey last October, we have shared our work and supported one another with our endeavors in writing. Each member has shared something with the group from her writing or from her family's published work.

Janis Keim shared her beautiful children's book she has written and illustrated called Little Lamb's Journey to Bethlehem. Her book is filled with spiritual meaning; this was a labor of love that showcases Janis' creativity and love of humanity.

Nancy Neal read a piece she wrote describing the beautiful scenery from a trip to the ocean; we could see the gorgeous land-scape with her words, and feel the texture of her experience.

Amy Feidler shared from her Great-Grandfather W.A. Stevens' book, Sod House to Shelterbelt, A Pioneer Story. When he was 81 years old his daughters helped him publish it in 1951. His story of the blizzard of 1888 got us talking and sharing our own stories of family, snow storms, and loss.

Mary Lou Jambor has begun writing the story of three generations of her maternal grandmother's family who emigrated in the 1890's from Frank, Russia. As she shared her talented writing, her detailed descriptions and family artifacts made her words come to life.
